Bold Moves: Strategy of the Month

Strategy: "Start with Strengths" Meetings

Before diving into procedures and paperwork, build connection by hosting short "Start with Strengths" chats with your team or students' families. Ask:

- "What are you most proud of from last year?"
- "What helps you feel supported and seen?"
- "What's one strength you want to grow this year?"

These conversations build trust, self-awareness, and a strengths-based culture from Day 1.
