You'll surely see me wearing green on March 17. Like many of you, I'm proud of my Irish heritage.


My people crossed the Atlantic from western Ireland and landed in Canada, traveled down to Wisconsin, and eventually ventured west to Minnesota.


The specific link to Wayzata was my grandmother Elizabeth. She arrived here in the 1930s.

NEIGHBORHOOD SPOTLIGHT: The Dynan Family



So a few months ago, I was thinking about the March issue and what stories to write. As you can see, this issue is very much an ode to St. Patrick's Day and all

And then it came to me like a beacon in the dark. Well, it was literally a light shining in the night. I'm talking about the green and white neon sign of Wayzata Home Laundry & Dry Cleaners that shines along Wayzata Boulevard. The business logo incorporates a four leaf clover. The family-owned business has been serving Wayzata residents since 1955.

"We were in the basement of Welch's bait shop on Lake Street across from Lyman Lumber," said Kevin Dynan.

It moved to the area where Colonial Square stands today. By the early 1960s, the business landed in its final location - a home converted into a laundry cleaning shop.

But let's back up a bit, OK, quite a bit.

Like many families that emigrated from Ireland, Michael and Hannorah Dynan entered America at Staten Island, New York. This was 1850. From there the family moved to Illinois and finally Minnesota. Their son John married a woman named Julie O'Brien. The couple had eight children. Their youngest, Michael, married Pearl McAlpine.

Pearl had been working at a catering business and was a part of a team servicing a wedding for the Pillsburys at their mansion on Brackett's Point. She was well-liked. In fact, one of the guests asked if she had heard that the Fadden family was looking to retire from their laundry business and were looking for a buyer.

Pearl and her husband talked it over and applied for a loan to buy the business but were denied.

"People who were at that wedding got wind of it," said Kevin Dynan. "Ten to thirteen people co-signed on the loan so they could take the business over."

The Dynans were in the laundry business.

At first, the business had only laundry services. It would later add dry cleaning to the mix.

This mom and pop shop was the quintessential family business. The Dynan' children were an integral part growing up. But it wasn't all work.

"Numerous winter days Mom would drop Maureen (Kevin's sister) and I off at Klapprich Park," said Kevin. "Ed Klapprich would come down and if it was 10:30 a.m. and you weren't chaperoned by a parent, he would take your hockey sticks away and you had to play pom-pom-pull-away." Kevin has a lot of fond memories of Klapprich.

Kevin Dynan and his wife Janet run the show these days. Spend some time with them at their business and their pride is evident. They both love this place and it shows.

And even before the laundry business, Janet was making community connections.

"I worked as a long distance operator in Wayzata, right out of high school," said Janet. "I was lowest for seniority and I got the leftovers for shifts."

Kevin and Janet raised five boys. One lives in the Twin Cities, one in Wisconsin, two in Colorado, and one in Saudi Arabia. After high school they all continued their education. They were pretty darn good hockey players - in fact, three of them played together at Gustavus Adolphus and a fourth played at Bethel.

The boys went on to pursue various careers and at this point don't intend to take over the family business when Janet and Kevin retire.

And business isn't slowing down. Especially when you have multi-generational customers knocking at the door.

"We'll get some young kids in their 20s come in and they'll say 'my Grandma told me I had to come here', said Janet. "We are a third generation (customer) business."

The Dynans have had several inquiries about the property and business. These calls came from developers as well as other laundry cleaning businesses. So far, the Dynans haven't been interested, as it has to be the right dry cleaners or developer.

If that happens, there may be strings attached. See, the Dynans' business is woven into the community of Wayzata. It's not just because it's been here nearly 70 years.

"We do the Coats For Kids for St. Bart's." "That's something I would like to see continuing."

So, whether you're driving by this business along Wayzata Boulevard by day or night, the Wayzata Home Laundry & Dry Cleaning sign is plain to see.

They Dynans will take care of you as they've done for nearly 70 years now.

WAYZATA'S IRISH HISTORY: Green Genes

By mid-month, you'll see folks around Wayzata sporting green in honor of St. Patrick's Day.

Wayzata has had residents living here with Irish ancestry from the get go. U.S. Census records and old newspaper articles help paint the past's picture.

According to 1885 records, James & Bridget Gallagher, Patrick & Mary Grigas, and James Perry all reported being born in Ireland or having parents who were born in Ireland. It's noted that Perry was a farmer.

Bridget Wise is listed as having Irish ancestry in the 1900 census. She was the wife of well known boatbuilder Thomas Wise. Meanwhile, William Rice and John O'Shea were listed as boarders.

There are themes throughout these records. Many listed their occupations as farmers. Meanwhile, Murray Domnick was listed as a private estate caretaker in 1910. So too were John & Norah McEnter in the 1930 census. Perhaps they lived in some of those guesthouses on the larger estates still standing in parts of the area.

Frank O'Keefe was working as a railroad worker in 1930. Makes sense, right? The Irish were instrumental to the expansion of the railroads beginning in the 1800s.

It gets a little tougher to determine who was Irish beginning with the 1940 census. Part of this was due to the reports no longer having parents' birth country listed. Also, with every passing generation, more of the Irish were born here in the States.

Unless you knew about a family's lineage, it's not easy to pull that information from these reports.

I'm fortunate to have a distant relative who wrote a book tracing our family's Irish roots.

I won't document all the stops along the way, but my family's connection with Wayzata is based on

my full-blooded Irish grandmother, Elizabeth. Her maiden name was Hedican and she grew up on the Iron Range and attended nursing school in Duluth.

She moved to Wayzata and married her first husband, a full-blooded Irishman named Joseph O'Connell. He was part owner of The Minnetonka Herald newspaper and Foursome clothing store. Joseph would die in 1944 in a hunting accident leaving my grandmother a widow with three children. She would later marry my grandfather in 1948.

Despite making Wayzata a home, Elizabeth never forgot her roots on the Range. And this is no blarney - her father Patrick was actually born on St. Patrick's Day. It was an annual tradition for her to travel north to celebrate his birthday as well as the beloved holiday. In fact, the Wayzata community section of The Minnetonka Herald newspaper documented it.

Mrs. J.M. O'Connell and little son Joey, Dave Hedican [O'Connell's brother] and Miss Shirley Braden spent last weekend visiting Virginia, Minn., the occasion being the St. Patrick's Day birthday of Mrs. O'Connell's and Mr. Hedican's father, Patrick Hedican.

So, how did the rest of Wayzata celebrate St. Patrick's Day way back when?

Once again, The Minnetonka Herald brings us back to that time.

A Wayzata Food Store advertisement in the March 3, 1949, newspaper listed cabbage for six cents per pound and a can of corned beef hash for 35 cents.

And there was one place in Wayzata to be on the big day - the Wayzata American Legion.

Wayzata Legion to Hold Dance March 17

The Wayzata American Legion post will greet the annual arrival of St. Patrick's Day, March 17 with their traditional dancing party in the local club rooms. Mort Marcy, entertainment chairman, urges all Legionnaires and friends of the post to plan on attending this gala event.

"You don't have to be Irish to have a bang-up time on St. Pat's Day at the Legion Hall," Marcy said. The Ad Lib Four (Vukas, Budnick, Braden, Bushnell et al) will be back on the band-stand furnishing music for dancing from 9 to 1.

And even now, the Legion is still a fun place for St. Patrick's Day shenanigans!

So, later this month, when the weather is hopefully warmer, more and more folks will be out walking Lake Street. And if you pass someone and their Irish eyes are smiling, smile back and wish them well.

Car Accident Injuries


