

Alex Plechash: A Lifetime Of Service

You may know Wayzata resident Alex Plechash as your neighbor, you may know him as a member of the Wayzata City Council. But you may not necessarily know that he is a veteran and has quite an impressive military service record.

"My first inspiration occurred when I was about six years old," said Plechash. "The family that lived next door were all Marines. I looked up to them as role models. As I got older, John Glenn became a hero of mine. He was a Marine fighter pilot and astronaut and served as an inspiration to me."

Plechash grew up in the Chicago suburb of Oak Park, Illinois. In high school he played football, was a wrestler, and was on the track team. He began his military career at the U.S. Naval Academy where he earned a degree in Aerospace Engineering and had the distinction of being the number one ranked Marine Officer in his class. In his senior year, he was nominated for a Rhodes scholarship and won a Guggenheim Fellowship for PhD study at Princeton, Cal Tech and MIT.

After graduating from Annapolis, Plechash reported for duty to the Marine Corps Basic School at Quantico where he graduated at the top of his class of 270 Marine Lieutenants. Although deeply drawn toward becoming a Marine infantry officer, he ultimately chose

to go to flight school and earned his Naval Aviator wings and transitioned to the F-4 Phantom II – the most prolific supersonic fighter of all time.

While serving in the Fleet Marine Force, Alex made deployments to the Western Pacific and Asian Theater of Operations and was twice selected for early promotion. He attended the U.S. Navy Fighter Weapons School - more commonly referred to as TOPGUN - and earned designations as an Air Combat Tactics Instructor; Weapons Tactics Instructor; and Fleet Test Pilot. He has logged nearly 2000 hours in jets of various types including the F/A-18 Hornet.

An interesting footnote is that early in his career, Alex appeared in the movie "The Great Santini" starring Robert Duvall when his squadron was used on-location at MCAS Beaufort, SC during the filming of the movie.

Following his military career he went into the world of business and eventually moved to Wayzata. "I like the fact that it is a small town with a distinct downtown area," said Plechash. "It has a character that is unique among all towns in the Lake Minnetonka region and has a reputation for being outsized given its small population."

Plechash is currently in his second term on the Wayzata City Council. Earlier this year, he retired after 16 years as a volunteer firefighter. He serves as a national committeeman representing the state of Minnesota in The Republican National Committee.

Veterans Day, November 11, is a great time to remember the more than 150,000 men and women currently serving overseas in the U.S. military. But unless you have a loved one overseas, it may not be top of mind.

I stumbled upon an interesting nugget when researching Wayzata's military history. I was "introduced" to the Cleveland family. John Cleveland was a local butcher and had three sons. He and his boy Harold appeared in the October 1, 1942 Minneapolis Morning Tribune close to a year into America's involvement in World War II. See, Harold had just returned from the Great Lakes Naval Training station. This inspired his father to enlist at age 50! Harold's two other brothers, Robert and Lawrence, were serving in the Army.

You gotta think that the Cleveland men wrote letters home to family and friends. That was a big deal back in the 40s when it was really the only way to communicate. I found an old letter at the Wayzata Historical Society written by Wayzata High School grad John Batson. It was dated March 7, 1942 with a location of Northern Ireland. In the letter he stated that he was writing the correspondence on airmail stationery and that he was limited to two pages to stay under the half ounce weight limit. You could tell how much getting mail meant to him. "I enjoyed all your many letters folks," wrote Batson. "I think I will get mail quite frequently now."

Of course it wasn't just the men serving in WWII. The Christmas Eve, 1942 Minnetonka Herald newspaper featured a story about Lt. Bernice Nilson. She graduated from Wayzata High School in 1936. In 1941, she enlisted in the army nurses corps and was directed into active training. At the time of the article, she was stationed at Camp Forrest, Tennessee expecting to be sent on active service abroad.

Please take a minute or two to think about those currently serving overseas. Veterans Day is a perfect day to do that - heck, everyday is a good day to reflect.

Healthy Fall Habits

The fall and winter months in Minnesota are more challenging than sunny summer days when it comes to staying healthy. There is a reason we call it the "flu season" and why it always happens in the winter.

The fall and winter brings shorter days, less sunshine and less outdoor activities in the fresh air. Natural Vitamin D is not produced in our skin without summer sunshine, so supplementing with Vitamin D is very important, living in the northern hemisphere.


5,000 I.U.s daily is a good amount for most people. A quick blood test can determine your blood levels, which optimally should be between 60-80. Low levels make you much more prone to viral and other infections and illnesses, but you also don't want to get into toxic levels above 100. Zinc also is important for optimal immune function. Around 20 mg/day is adequate for most people. Quercetin, a flavonol found in fruits and vegetables, helps drive zinc inside the cells to optimize its immune-enhancing function. 500-1,000 mg in a pill form per day is recommended.


