

Big Woods:A Towering Legacy

Wayzata has trees and lots of them. And that's not simply by accident. Through the years, there has been a big effort to make sure trees were a part of our community's future. There's no taller task than the preservation of what's known as the Big Woods. It's an area just to the north of Wayzata Boulevard adjacent to the Colonial Square shopping mall.

The park is celebrating 20 years of official preservation this year. Back in 2004, there were discussions about developing the area after the Sisters of the Cenacle convent decided to sell their property which included the Big Woods. Preserving the land took root and a number of private citizens, government, and non profits came together to get the land.


This is no ordinary group of trees, the Big Woods Preserve is one of the last patches of hardwood forest that once covered all of central Minnesota. Walking the hidden trail that winds through the 14 acres is immersive. You almost forget you're in a bustling commercial part of town within a larger metro network. It's a beautiful break from the busy life we live in. You'll also note a 1930s Tudor Estate located on this piece of land. It's owned by the recovery organization, The Retreat, and is preserved just like the woods that surround it.

There were a number of individual champions that made the Big Woods Preserve a reality. The Friends of the Big Woods was formed by Wayzata residents. The group worked tirelessly to preserve the property for generations to come.


People power provided the heavy lifting, but it was funding that sealed the deal. In November of 2003 a referendum went before local voters. It was not a slam dunk. It passed by 51 votes - which issued \$3 million in bonding money. After three years of persistence by a diverse group of residents, spearheaded by Phil Harder, Sr., Dick Howell, Dick Harmon and Merrily Borg Babcock in collaboration with The Trust for Public Land officials, the property was saved. But that was only part of what was needed. Private donations helped secure the "donut" or woods surrounding the building.

Big Woods is open all year. You may have to hunt a bit to find the entrance, but it's well worth it. The preserve butts up against Colonial Square and you can park your car immediately as you enter the driveway just to the east along Wayzata Boulevard. And circle September 25th on your calendar - that's the official anniversary of the preservation of this community gem.

Wintertime could mean a quiet bug free stroll through snow covered woods. March is usually the time when the Sugar Maples sap becomes active. An occasional maple tree tapping can be scheduled. You can enjoy the native wildflowers in the spring. Summertime has the trees in full bloom, green and lush canopy that almosts touches the sky. It truly is an experience that transports you to another world and simpler time. And In the fall the spectacular beauty of a forest filled with Sugar Maples and Basswood Trees.

Minnesota residents 16 and older may fish without a license if they're with children younger than 16.



Do I need a fishing license?

To legally fish in Minnesota, all residents of Minnesota age 16 through 89, must have a current Minnesota fishing license. You must carry your license when fishing or traveling from an area where you were fishing.

Community Champion: Merrily Babcock

"A community is only as good as its volunteers," said Wayzata resident Merrily Babcock.

Babcock has been a volunteer for Wayzata for decades. She has served on various boards and committees for decades now. Perhaps what she is best known for is her environmental efforts.

She owes much of her passion for volunteering and environmental preservation to her dad. "My father was a big influence on me," said Babcock. "We would dig up

wildflowers in all the places that were going to be developed. He knew a lot of this was going to be destroyed."

Babcock currently serves on the City of Wayzata Parks & Trails board. And between mid-February and mid-March, she is extra busy tapping maple trees. For 14 years she has organized a group of folks to do the tapping. It's quite the process as a large amount of sap only produces a small amount of maple syrup.



One of the things she is most proud of is the preservation of a patch of trees located near the Colonial Square shopping area. It's now known as the Big Woods Park Reserve. It's a wonderful area just off the hustle and bustle of Wayzata Boulevard. There are wellmaintained walking trails that allow you and your family to spend time immersed in a forest that is in the middle of the city.

But there was a point where that area was considered for development. "We started out with three people," said Babcock. "We went before the city council and they had to open up the church because there were

so many people." That was 2004 - the park's 20-year anniversary. And this also means that the bonding dollars that were used to finance the project have been paid off.


"It was a community effort for sure."

Earth Day is celebrated each year on April 22. It's all about educating people about the importance of environmental protection. The roots of Earth Day can be traced back to 1969.

In January of that year some three million gallons of oil spilled off the coast of Santa Barbara, California. More than 10,000 animals were killed in the disaster. The following year, Earth Day was born. More than 20 million Americans participated in that first Earth Day. Nearly 200 countries now celebrate Earth Day. The official theme of the 2024 Earth Day is "Planet vs. Plastics."

Meanwhile, on the local level, the City of Wayzata will hold an Earth Day event on Saturday, April 27 from 1-3 pm on the Panoway Plaza. The event will feature two educational speakers that will focus on native plants, pollinators, and pollinator-friendly lawns. A drawing for a free rain barrel and composting bin will be held near the end of the event. Additional educational materials will be available along with examples of electric lawn care equipment.

There's another date to circle on your calendars. That's Saturday, May 18. The City of Wayzata will celebrate Arbor Day with a number of activities on Panoway Plaza:

Potted Shade Tree Drawing – Residents are welcome to submit their name for a chance to win one of 50 potted trees to plant on their Wayzata property. Species include Swamp White Oak, Black Walnut, Ironwood, Serviceberry, and disease-resistant American Elm, which will be delivered to the homes of the lucky winners following the event.

Champion Tree Contest – The City of Wayzata will be accepting submissions to its second annual Champion Tree Contest, where residents can nominate a tree with an especially tall canopy or wide trunk for a chance to win one of two gift cards to local tree nurseries. The winners will be announced one week later through the City's social media channels.

Informational Speaker – A guest arborist will discuss the significance of Wayzata's tree canopy and share their thoughts about how we as a community can make it more resilient. The speaker and City staff will be available after the presentation to answer tree-related questions from attendees.
