The Muni: Community Cornerstone

The Wayzata Bar & Grill has been a mainstay in Wayzata for decades. It's affectionately known as the Muni. While the restaurant is a fixture now, the start took some doing.

In the mid-1940s the city of Wayzata was looking for additional revenue sources. Some Minnesota cities at the time had launched municipal liquor stores. These were profitable.

The idea was first floated before residents in 1945. By a vote of 171-106, the measure failed.

Folks living in Wayzata would sing a different song in 1947.

They voted on a number of options to increase revenue that year. The most votes went to the establishment of a municipal liquor store.

The liquor store opened on Lake Street in September of 1947. The first manager was my grandfather, Lawrence Leding.

Years later, a restaurant was added.

The place had a number of names through the years including the Blue Room, Town Tavern, and the Port O' Call Bistro. But it's always been known as the Muni.

The current location opened in 2011.

From its humble beginnings to what it is now, this Wayzata mainstay is always a hub of activity for the community.

Even the address, 747 Mill Street, is a subtle reminder of '47, the year it all began.



You won't find a friendlier couple.

They both grew up in small New York towns separated by a river just northwest of New York City near the Pennsylvania border.

Despite attending different high schools, fate would have Elaine and Bob attending a history class in summer school.

"There was a sense of connection," said Bob. "I was hooked immediately."

They dated in high school and continued their courtship when both went off to college - Elaine in New Jersey and Bob in Rhode Island.

"At one point, I felt he was getting a little pushy," said Elaine.

In fact, Elaine sent Bob a Dear John letter and said it would be better to go separate ways.

"I look back on it now and I think it was really wise for me to not just jump into a relationship that started when we were really quite young," said Elaine.

Elaine later realized that nobody could quite compare to Bob and they reignited their relationship. Their path together would then take a southern route.

Bob's father had a job transfer which took him to Alabama. "The whole family was down there other than me," said Bob. "I ended up going to the University of Alabama."

In the spring of 1967, Elaine had graduated from college. A few months later, the couple was married and living in Alabama.

In the mid 1960s, Alabama was at the center of our nation's Civil Rights movement. It was eye opening

Years later the pair moved to Minnesota when Bob took a job at the state capitol in St. Paul. They then ventured west to Wayzata.

So, what's the secret to this longevity?

"I think it's a blessing. Also, I'm perfect," joked Elaine.

On a serious note, being in the middle of the Civil Rights movement in Alabama back in the late 1960s shaped their relationship for the rest of their lives.

"I think it forged our relationship through fire in many ways," said Elaine. "I think we responded to the social strife in different ways and we grew with it."

They are proud parents of two boys. One has made a career as an artist and the other is working as a psychological counselor.

Bob and Elaine will celebrate 55 years of marriage later this year.


