Who Are You Looking For?

Our Lenten journey has urged us onward as seekers with probing questions of faith. We come now to Holy Week with more questions. We gather with the crowd at the Palm Sunday parade to ask ourselves, "How will I respond to Jesus? Where am I headed?" We ask the same question Peter asked of Jesus, "Will you wash my feet?" And perhaps we can relate to the questions Jesus asks God from the cross, "Why have you forsaken me?" Soon we will be hearing the question Jesus asks Mary in the garden, "Who are you looking for?"

"Who are you looking for?" That may be the best question and most complicated of all. It is the same question Jesus asks the threatening crowd who came to the garden at night with torches and weapons:



"Who are you looking for?" Sometimes we are looking for someone we have defined based upon our own perceptions. Sometimes we diagnose someone as a threat, defining them on our own terms, rather than by who they are. When Judas led the crowd with swords to the garden in search of Jesus, they were looking for someone they saw as a blasphemer and troublemaker. They were looking for a problem to get rid of. They may have known Jesus by name, but did they truly know the one they were looking for? Mary came to the garden looking for a mortally wounded Jesus: a broken, lifeless body. She was looking for the dead man whose body had been laid to rest in the tomb. Mary defined who she was looking for by her own expectations. And what about us? Might we be looking for a Jesus who mirrors our own theological or political perspective? Answering the question of who we are looking for comes with the risk of confining Jesus and restricting Jesus, as if we can create Jesus in our own image. It has been said that Peter was the most honest when he spoke his words of denial on the night of Jesus' arrest: "I do not know the man."

What would happen if instead, we let Jesus define himself. What difference would it make to the angry crowd, to Mary, or to us, if we would respond to the question with Jesus' own words saying, "I am looking for the one who said he is 'the way, the truth, and the life."

Even though we know the story of Easter, and we know not to expect to find Jesus in the tomb, do we really know where Jesus will show up? How he will appear to us? When he will come to us? Doesn't the resurrection story tell us that Jesus is more likely to surprise us by showing up where we least expect him? And when we do see him, isn't he likely to appear different from who we expect? Let us continue seeking with open hearts, open mind, and open eyes. Co-Pastors Ann and Charlie Lewis

A much enjoyed and meaningful tradition at FPCS, we will be offering a light soup supper and short devotional service during each evening of Holy Week. The soup suppers start at 6 PM with the service from 7 to 7:30 PM (with the exception of a full service on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday at 7 PM). Various congregational members and pastoral staff will provide leadership for the services and our Community Life Ministry Team will organizing the soup suppers. Childcare will be provided to enable parents with young children to attend. We hope you will take the wonderful opportunity for each evening of Holy Week to gather together as we devote ourselves to God and each other in prayer and reflection.

One Great Hour of Sharing

As part of our Lenten season of growth and giving, we will be receiving the One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) offering on Palm Sunday, April 2. This has commonly been the largest of our special offerings during the year (est. average has been \$3,000), helping provide food, blankets, medicines, agricultural tools, and education to reduce suffering and poverty. In addition, the OGHS offering provides relief to millions of persons displaced from their homes due to war, famine, and natural disasters. Begun in 1949, the OGHS offering is supported by eight denominations and Church World Service (the CROP Walk folks). Thank you in anticipation for your gift to One Great Hour of Sharina.

Endowment Scholarships





Being Presbyterian means we are part of a larger family that supports one another. We do that, in part, through our per capita gift. Our per capita gift is what all the members of each Presbyterian Church pays to cover the operating overhead of the church at the Presbytery, Synod and General Assembly in order to allow 100% of our giving to the larger church to go to mission. You might think of the per capita giving (\$52 this year) as all the members of a household pooling their resources to cover the operating expenses like the electrical bill and utility bills so that the rest of their gifts can cover the major items like food and housing payments.




Deacon's Offering: First Sunday of Every Month


