Many of us have been to the circus or seen trapeze artists, gifted at "flying through the air with the greatest of ease." There always comes that moment of suspense when one lets go of the bar and leaps or somersaults through the air to the hands of a partner or to the bar swinging toward them. For that brief moment as they are suspended in midair, the audience looks on in awe, wonder, and a little uncertainty - until the next bar is solidly in hand or the catcher has grasped hold of the hands of the one making the leap.



Transition times in a church are a little like

this, as we let go of something and ready ourselves to grasp hold of what's coming next. For those wondering what's coming next in terms of staffing, we have our Director of Youth and Family Ministries, Felipe Ocampo, leaving us and it seems we're in mid-air awaiting the opportunity to take hold of what's next. If you are watching and wondering, our session has a search process well under way, looking for a Temporary Associate Pastor who will cover a wide variety of ministries with a major focus on youth ministry. Our elders are looking now at candidates, and are committed to prayerfully discern who will be the best match for our congregation and position. For the present time, it may feel like we are in mid-air until we've laid hold of the new pastoral staff person.

In actuality, we are in the hands already of some very capable and seasoned leaders. We're thankful for several people stepping in to carry us through this interim period of "being in suspense." Scott Miller is stepping in to lead our 5-10 Middle School / Jr. High Youth on Wednesdays while Mary Boose, who has been worshipping with us this last year and feeding our Jr. High group, is stepping in to lead our 6-11 Sr. High students on Thursdays. Both Scott and Mary are professional educators with a lifetime of serving as volunteers in Christian ministry to youth and children. We will be identifying an assistant for each of them. Cathy Haddenham will continue to provide dinners for youth on Thursdays and a team of cooks will provide dinners on Wednesdays. These dinner hosts will not only nourish bodies, but nurture relationships with the youth over dinner. We could not be more thankful to Scott, Mary, Cathy, & other volunteers for their commitment to our youth. These key volunteers will keep our youth ministry in the air and moving toward the oncoming new associate who will catch the bar and carry us onward and upward.

So if you wonder how long we'll be in suspense, know that our young people are in caring, capable hands already. And when the new associate arrives, our youth will swing from one set of caring, capable hands to another. As we're in this transition, we ask that you consider not just looking on as a spectator, but becoming part of the act yourself by praying for and encouraging our youth, temporary youth leaders, and our search process.



It has been a good two years since our church operated in a




Our September book club selection is <u>The Lost and Found</u>

Dear friends,

On Monday, August 1, two trucks and six men showed up to pack my belongings out of my Pointe home. My daughter Talitha had arrived the morning before and we oversaw the packing together. I was so grateful for her company and assistance!

Tali and I left Washington State on Tuesday afternoon, August 2nd, driving my little Honda CRV stacked to the top with my clothes, Steff's Love rose given to me by a student 12 years ago in honor of Steff's passing, yellow calla lilies dug up from my yard which had been a house warming gift from a friend when I moved into the Pointe, and a large new





road atlas to expand the driving information provided by our two GPS phones, and a lump in my throat as I left my home, family, friends, church, and the Pacific Northwest.



We journeyed to North Carolina in four days, staying in hotels that my son-in-law Phil arranged each afternoon using his Marriott awards, and singing and talking the miles away as we drove 11 hours daily. Along the way, I thought I caught a head cold. We stopped at Mount Rushmore for a quick look and took a photo with the wonderful Mount Rushmore card that granddaughter Kylie had made for us.

Phil greeted us at 11:00 PM in the dark on Friday, waiting in the bright light of the garage and holding a COVID test in each hand. Sure enough, I had COVID, likely caught from one of the six packers, one of whom had been coughing. Fortunately, Tali had already had COVID and was none the worse for having been cooped up with me in the car and hotel rooms.

But COVID sure put a damper on my arrival! Gone was the Hollywood version of arrival with the family jumping up and down, waving and holding welcome home banners! We snuck

in like thieves in the night and I beat a fast retreat to the guest room where I stayed for six more days, venturing out only to the screened -in porch to eat meals with the family seated apart from me. I felt okay, but it sure was discouraging to be so pent up! This pic shows Kylie promising to give me hugs when I tested negative for Covid!



I put that time of isolation to good use and developed a list of homes I wanted to see on Thursday, August 11, when I could

rejoin the human race. Along with my real estate agent, Tali and Phil, we visited five homes, two of which I loved: a brand new build in a 55 plus community and a 15 year old home—both of which were one story homes. I chose the new build, put in an offer knowing that four other folks were viewing the home the same day, and my offer was accepted! I hope to move in sometime in September. Though slightly smaller than my previous home, I have a guest room for visitors and an office, as well as a lovely open floor plan with wonderful light streaming in. It's about 20 minutes away from Tali and her family.
