In August we were able to help 355 people, 98 of those were new. We gave out 3.881 food items, 216 bread, and 234 personal hygiene items. We were able to share the gospel with 43 people. Praise the Lord, we had 1 come to know Christ as their Savior and 1 rededication.

<u>Past year review:</u> From September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022 we were able to help 2,720 people, 459 were new. We gave out 41,294 food items, 2,361 bread, and 2,591 personal hygiene items. We were able to share the gospel with 330 people and we had 5 salvations.




