The 2019-20 School Year Starts on a High Note with New Instruments Added to All School Music Programs!

As a community we have made a commitment that ALL students will have access to music from kindergarten through 12th grade. Almost 1,200 students in Lincoln City Schools are now enrolled in music. We are grateful to our donors and local community for contributing to the 2019-20 music program and fulfilling the needs of our teachers and students. Together we reached our goal! MII was able to purchase new instruments and supplies and repair existing instruments for the 2019-2020 school year for all our Lincoln City students!

How can instruments live a long life? 🎯

With care! Students in grades 6 through 12 make a commitment to care for instruments, practice daily, participate in all performances and pay for all damages or loss. Our young musicians clean the instrument daily and transport it in a case. Because of their vigilance, we are now ordering new cases! Our program for repair and renovation ensures that instruments in our "music library" are kept in working condition. A total of 36 instruments were repaired for a cost of \$2,030 during the 2018-19 year.

They instruct small groups of students in sectionals like percussion, coach soloists before an upcoming performance and help assess students' proficiency throughout the year. The expertise of our technicians is unparalleled for a small rural community. In addition, Technicians complete Safe Schools Training and other requirements.

Your donations help fund five technicians at a total cost of \$20,000 for stipends annually.
