retained jobs, as well as improved their systems and processes. The total estimated economic impact? Over \$5.95 million was injected into our local economy last year alone.

Through our Economic Inclusion Program, in partnership with the Greater Milwaukee Urban League, we have connected over 200 enterprises with procurement opportunities from major companies, including Meijer and Kohl's—bringing local businesses to the doors of national retailers.

And because we know that people are the heart of any economy, we've invested in workforce development. In collaboration with MATC, we trained 23 individuals in computer literacy, equipping them with tools to compete in today's digital economy. And with Racine County, we celebrated with 12 returning citizens who graduated from our food management program—proof that second chances can create a lasting impact.

Together, we have proven that the Latino Chamber of Commerce is not just an advocate—it's a catalyst for transformation.

Latinos contribute more than \$11 billion in buying power in Wisconsin—and nationally, if U.S. Latinos were their own economy, we'd be the fifth largest in the world. We are not just part of the American dream. We are making it real every single day.
