St. Patrick's Elementary is a Catholic Independent School of the Vancouver Archdiocese. An elementary school, established by St. Patrick's Parish, it follows the policies and procedures recommended by the Catholic Independent School Vancouver Archdiocese (CISVA).

The Pastor works together with the Parish Education Committee (PEC) which is composed of five elected and two appointed members.

The Education Committee assists the Pastor in carrying out the responsibilities laid out in the Policy and Structure for the administration of schools within the Society. They then delegate the authority to the Principal who oversees the day to day operation of the school and the areas pertaining to the academics.

The philosophy of our Catholic school expresses the teaching and practice of the Roman Catholic Church and must be supported by all members of the community. Partners (home, school, parish) in Catholic education must work together to provide an environment where faith and learning go hand in hand leading the young people to be the best they can be.





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The Parish Education Committee (PEC) is a group of parent volunteers tasked by both the Archdiocese and CISVA for the promotion, operation and internal management of St. Patrick's Elementary School.

Duties:

•Develop local policies in collaboration with the Principal and Pastor

Participate in long-term planning in consultation with school stakeholders: Pastor, Principal, and parents.
Ensure the safe and orderly operation of the school in the following areas: collection of fees, payment of operating expenses, facilities, maintenance, and

•parent participation.



Admission of students is granted with the following priorities:

1. Children presently enrolled in St. Patrick's School if they and their families meet the expectations of the school.

2. Siblings of children already in St. Patrick's School, whose families are practicing Catholics active in St. Patrick's Parish.

3. Children whose families are practicing Catholics active in St. Patrick's Parish.

4. Siblings of children already in St. Patrick's School, whose families are practicing Catholics active in other parishes.

5. Children whose families are practicing Catholics coming into St. Patrick's Parish, who have been attending Catholic school elsewhere.

6. Children whose families are practicing Catholics active in other parishes.

7. Children whose families are either not practicing Catholics or not active in their parishes.

8. Non-Catholics. Once accepted into the school, non-Catholics need meet only the criteria expected of other students to be re-admitted in subsequent years. Siblings of non-Catholics cannot be given priority over Catholics.

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Step 1: Complete the application package. This will be uploaded to the school website by January 6 2023

Step 2: Submit <u>in person</u> to the front office the application, supporting documents and the \$50 registration fee <u>per</u> <u>child</u> (cash or cheque only)

Step 3: The office will schedule an interview (Zoom or in person) with parent/s and child

Step 4: If accepted, an acceptance package will be forwarded and must be completed with supporting documents.

This will include instructions for uniform, pre-authorized payments, fees etc.
