Religion: Liturgical Year, Parables, Lent

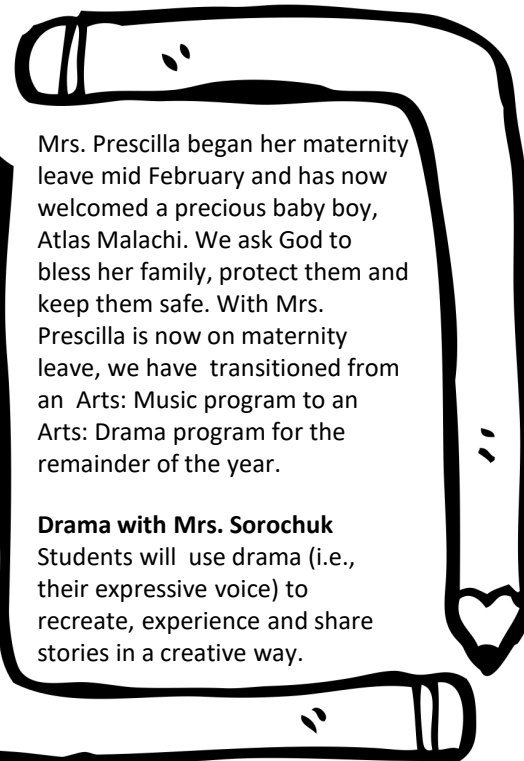
Reading: Questioning Fiction and Non Fiction literature, text features
