

The month of November is an important time of remembrance. We begin first with All Saints Day on November 1st followed by All Souls' Day on November 2nd. These special Days celebrate and honor all the saints worldwide who have entered heaven. It is a Holy Day of obligation, where we as Catholics attend mass. All Souls Day allows us to offer prayers to those who have died, but have not yet reached heaven.

November 11, Remembrance Day, marks the anniversary of the official end of World War I in 1918. This is a Memorial Day, observed by countries within the Commonwealth, to remember the service people in the armed forces who served in the battle for good over evil.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Volunteer - Criminal Record Review

We have now successfully enrolled and are registered with the Criminal Record Review Program (CRRP).

Parents job:

- 1. Come into the office to complete the 'Volunteer Consent To A Criminal Record Check' document.
- 2. Bring in your primary and secondary I.D. so we can verify it.
- 3. Complete the checklist on the Cover Page.
- 4. Fill in your personal information on the application form.

The office will verify your identification and will submit the criminal record check on your behalf.

VISITORS and School Safety
