Reading and Spelling

The expectation is that your child will spend approximately 10 - 15 minutes each night practicing their spelling words. Additionally, students should be reading a book appropriate to their reading level every night. My hope is that students will develop their sight word vocabulary and fluency, but most importantly, will develop their love for reading.

Mathematics

Students have been working on:

- Reading and printing numerals
- Understanding numbers 1-10
- Skip counting (by 2's, 5's, 10's)
- Daily Calendar activities
- Identifying and Copying patterns
- Creating and Extending patterns (with 2 4 attributes)

Religion

We will continue practicing the sign of the cross, as well as the Hail Mary, Our Father and Glory Be. It would be wonderful if you could encourage your child to incorporate these prayers into your prayer time at home. Students are learning about the importance of being quiet and reverent during prayer time. Students have started to share special intentions. They are eager to pray for their families, friends, pets and for those less fortunate.
