The Spark – how to get there

The main entrance is via Norwood Ave BA2 7BA not Quarry Road.

As you approach the Sports Training Village there is parking on the left hand side of the road in car park A or G. These are the closest car parks to the sports village. Parking is free on a Sunday and you can also park in permit holders spaces too. If you can't park here continue past the main entrance and turn right. There are lots of spaces here too.

The Sports Training Village is on the right hand side of the road. You can't miss it, it's huge. Go in the main entrance where you will find our registration desks. They will show which way to go.

If you arrive really early for your round you may be asked to wait until the round before has finished before going into the hall. It will depend on the audience size.

There is a well stocked café but no food or drinks may be taken into the sports hall.
