Just sign in using your name and membership number such as John Doe (44444) and your password. Hold the cursor over the **Services** tab and click on **Chapter Membership (Join or Renew)** from the drop-down link.

This should bring you to the page showing the Nebraska Chapter.

You should have the option to pay for more than one year if you so choose.

Click on the **Next** button once you have made your decision.

The Payment Details page explains that you can either pay through your PayPal account or you can pay using a credit card.

Click on the **Pay** button. This will bring you to the page where you make your payment choice. Either click on the **Log in to PayPal** button or the **Pay with Debit or Credit Card** button. Choosing the Pay with Debit or Credit Card button brings you to the page where you fill in your credit card and billing information.

Under option #3, You will receive a confirmation email that the transaction was successful and I will also receive an email that you made the payment.

Check Presentation to Josh the Otter/JCMF

The Nebraska NCRS Chapter represented by Mike McFarland, Kathy, Brad Hillhouse, Melinda and Lowell Keedy presented a check in the amount of \$1,000 on December 29, 2021 to Kathy and Blake Collingsworth on behalf of Josh the Otter / Joshua Collingsworth Memorial Foundation (JCMF). The money was raised during the Nebraska Chapter's Third Annual LAST BLAST 2021 event that was held October 15 and 16, 2021 in Lincoln, NE.



As we continue to grow, one of the Nebraska Chapter's goals is to become a "TOP FLIGHT CHAPTER" with NCRS National. One of the requirements to achieve this status is to raise and donate funds each year to a 501c3 charity. For the past two years, the Nebraska Chapter's board has approved the JCMF Foundation as our charity of choice.

The Collingsworth's graciously helped us last year by providing a commercial building for our use for Last Blast 2020. The use of their building allowed us to not have to cancel LAST BLAST 2020 due to covid concerns.

The JCMF was started by the Collingsworth's after losing their 2-1/2 year-old son Joshua to a backyard swimming pool accident. The Foundation's mission is to help prevent infant and child drownings. JCMF teaches children as young as 6 months of age to turn over in the water and float on their back like a baby otter. The "Josh the Baby Otter" swim technique teaches children a fun way to learn how to be able to safely float in the water should they accidentally fall into a pool or bathtub.

The children's book "Josh the Baby Otter" is a very informative and entertaining story written by Blake Collingsworth that teaches children to mimic a baby otter floating on its back in the water. Over 500,000 copies of the book have been distributed to daycares, preschools and kindergarten classrooms across the country.

The NCRS Nebraska Chapter is proud to be a partner with the Foundation to help prevent child drownings and further their cause with our 2021 NCRS Nebraska Chapter donation. On the Road Again: MCACN—Muscle Car and Corvette Nationals

What do you call a car show that puts together the largest collection of classic factory-built muscle cars and Corvette's that have achieved NCRS Top Flight and Bloomington Gold awards in one venue?

It's called MCACN! (Muscle Car and Corvette Nationals). It takes place the weekend before Thanksgiving at Donald E. Stephens Convention Center in Rosemont, Ill. Just adjacent to O'Hare airport.



The Corvettes are judged mainly by top NCRS, and Bloomington Gold judges. If the points criteria are met, you will be awarded the MCACN Concours Gold award. If you have previously been awarded An NCRS Top Flight, a Bloomington Gold award and now a MCACN Concourse Gold award you receive the prestigious Triple Diamond award.

Brad Hillhouse, Gary Neimanis, and I took off for MCACN on Thursday November 18th. In a caravan of three, each pulling a car and trailer. We stayed just outside of Chicago that evening and were back on our way early Friday morning. I was very nervous, anticipating Chicago traffic and unloading and staging in a venue of just under 600 cars. Everything went great and my worrying was

for nothing. We were parked close together and were joined by chapter member Diane Quackenbush who brought her award winning 2004 Z06 LeMans Edition. Other chapter members in attendance without cars were, Patrick and Kim Santaniello, Jim Anderson, Jerry and Felicia Mulick and Mike and Betty Murray, Plus many, many of our NCRS friends. Patrick, Mike, Jim, Jerry, Gary and Brad all judged during the event.

The Illinois NCRS chapter put on a test chapter judging meet at the beginning of the show in which they Flight judged a couple of C2's and C3's. The idea was to see if it would be possible to have a full chapter judging meet at MCACN before the show. Bloomington Gold did the same. If this comes to fruition you should be able to compete for a Triple diamond award at a single show. We will see how this progresses.

After we got the cars staged and prepped for judging I took the time to walk through the rest of the show. As I walked through, my mouth was hanging open the whole time. There I saw some of the rarest 50's, 60's, and 70's muscle cars ever built. Plymouth, Dodge, Pontiac, Buick Oldsmobile, Ford, AMC, Studebaker, and Chevrolet in either beautiful original condition or highly restored. I guarantee you will never see more cars of this type and era in any other show than MCACN. Many of the cars are from personal collections that have never been shown to the public before. On Saturday and Sunday there were thousands of car enthusiasts that came from all over the U.S. and Canada to enjoy the cars and talk with owners. If you would like a visual taste of what this event is like, Brad Hillhouse did a video that can be seen on YouTube by going to the Corvette Genius Channel.

Our cars were judged on Saturday and that left Sunday to relax, walk around and talk to a great number of people. The awards presentation was late Sunday afternoon. It turned out to be a great afternoon as Gary's "91" ZR1, Brad's Bowtie "81", Diane's "04" Z06 Commemorative, and my Lowly "81" all received MCACN Triple Diamond Awards. My lowly "81" also received the Platinum Award which was the judges pick for top stock Corvette. Early Monday morning we loaded the cars, packed up all our loot from the awards presentation and headed for home.

I would have to say this is one of my very top car events I have been to and would suggest it to anyone that enjoys these types of automobiles. I have heard it said that this is "The Pebble Beach" of muscle car events and I would have to agree.

Nebraska Chapter Judging School & Technical Session for a 1953-1962 C1 Corvette Front End Suspension & Steering

On Saturday December 4th at Brad Hillhouse's shop, Brad Hillhouse and Lowell Keedy conducted a judging school on a C1 Corvette Front Suspension from a 1959 C1 Corvette.

Brad began by giving us some history on how and why it was decided to do a judging school on the C1 front-end suspension. A customer was looking for a old corvette but didn't want it to look like something her dad would drive. That corvette was found on the East Coast and was hauled back to Nebraska.

While they were inspecting the car they found the suspension needed some cleaning and while cleaning it up they noticed a spot on the lower control arm and that the control shaft was worn, and that when the car bounced it was hitting the A arm and making contact with the cross member. Well you know what happened next...took out 4 bolts and Boom the entire front-end suspension was removed and now on a bench.

Highlights from the judging school

- ◆ Identification of the front end suspensions components/parts were talked about, and were labeled on a print out that was passed out to participants.
- ◆ How to use the Judging Sheet when judging chaise on a C1.
- ◆ CDCIF and how it would be used when judging
- ◆ Demonstrated how the alignment was set for the caster and camber
- ◆ Assembly of the front end suspension on the demonstration table
- ◆ Lowell showed how to remove the grease zirk to adjust the front end alignment

Looking back on 2021, I would like to thank everyone that participated and helped NCRS Nebraska Chapter move forward in spite of all the challenges that COVID19 has done to our world.

We kicked off our year with several "online" meetings using Zoom as a way to stay in touch with each other and see what people were doing in the garage. Many Nebraska chapter members were also able to take advantage of NCRS online schools put on by other chapters and shared via Zoom for us to learn right from the comfort of our own homes. NCRS National has approved continuation of these online schools thru 2022 and it's a fantastic opportunity to take an hour on Saturday morning to learn more about Corvettes.

March found us on a road trip out to Grady Koch's garage to study his 1967 Coupe that is starting a restoration. Using the power of the internet we had people from 5 different states participate and learn more about what a Corvette looks like when it is all the way down to bare fiberglass.

April found us in Omaha at Victory Lane garages for our first judging meet of the year. We had three great Corvettes for judging including a rare Split Window and our first Concours modified Corvette. With NCRS Nebraska members from 4 states in attendance, our Spring Judging Meet was a big success. June, July & August were very busy for some chapter members attending regional meets in Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, and California.

As Fall started to roll in we had a judging school on originality using Mike McFarland's new 1972 LT1 4 star Bowtie. And October found us hosting our 3rd Annual LAST BLAST 2021 judging meet with 6 cars and 62 NCRS members from 9 different states attending the two day schools & judging meet. If you look at the 2022 chapter judging meets that other chapters are hosting, you will find that many are now adopting this two day, 5 point weekend format. It gives people a more relaxed judging atmosphere where learning and fun can happen in a less stressful environment.

We finished off the year in December with a judging school on C1 front suspensions. This was extremely well attended with 24 members joining us for a morning of learning the ins and outs of how to restore and rebuild a C1 suspension.

I am VERY EXCITED about 2022 and what it holds for our NCRS Nebraska Chapter. We are working on a Chapter calendar for this year that will include judging schools, tech schools, judging meets, social events and more. If you have an idea for an event or would be willing to host us, please let me or one of the officers know and we will see if we can make it happen.

2022 has many opportunities to attend regional and national events closer to us this year with almost no events on the coasts. I know many of us will be travelling to these events to judge, to be judged, to go to schools and more. NCRS Founders Award

This award was created by the National Corvette Restorers Society in 1995, in honor of the seven founding fathers of NCRS. The Founders Award encourages and recognizes the value and enjoyment of member participation in NCRS activities and demonstrates the NCRS commitment to equally recognize the significance of the "Driven Corvette" among our membership, regardless of NCRS Flight status achieved and applies to 1953 - 2004 Corvettes. To achieve this coveted award, an owner must first be a member of any NCRS Chapter.

Achieve any NCRS Flight award at a Chapter judging event, driven both ways. Achieve a 96% score on an operations check at a regional driven both ways. Achieve at least 10 points or more in the NCRS Judging or Tabulation recognition program. Submit an article for the "Corvette Restorer" magazine. Participate in the NCRS National Road Tour, a minimum of 500 miles.

Display the car and recheck the operations at the National Convention scoring at least 96%. It must all be accomplished within a three year period. Only 282 individuals have received the Founders award. One member has done it two years in a row. Those founding fathers present at our National Convention personally present the special plaque.

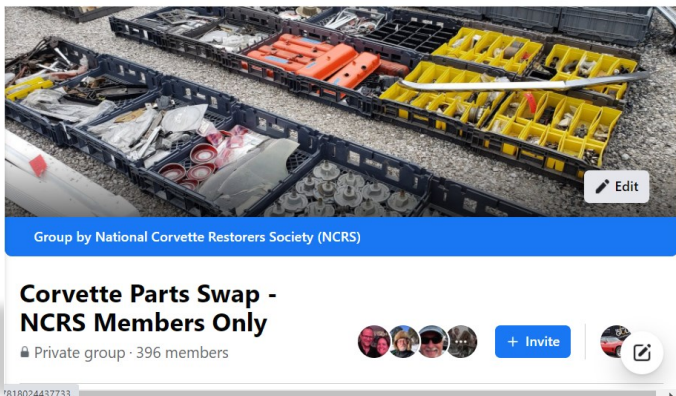

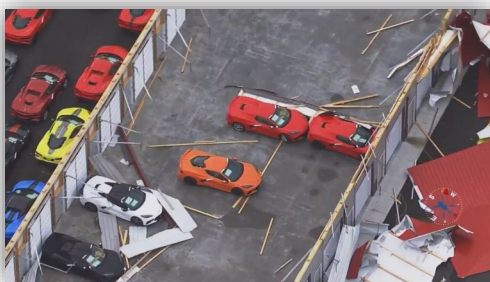
120 Corvettes damaged by December tornado to be crushed and the Bowling Green KY Corvette assembly plant is shutdown for repairs sustained from the tornado. Thought I would share for those that haven't seen it.

It's a video taken using a drone from svrweather in Kentucky. Thought I would share some of the description and a link to the video.

"Following the clean up of the Corvette Assembly Plant after a tornado struck Bowling Green in the early morning hours of December 11th, we learned that 115-122 Corvettes inside the plant would be crushed and those customers would have new orders put back into the production cycle.

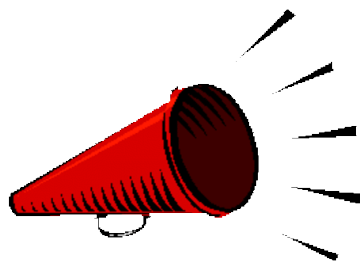
As the drone moves over the different cars, you can see an "X" painted on the windshield as if to indicate that workers marked any car that was observed to have any damage from the water or roof collapse, much like rescue workers mark a house after it was searched during an emergency event."
