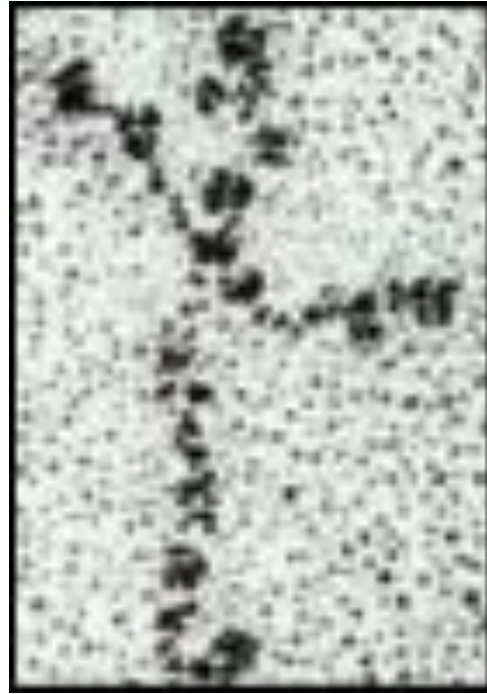
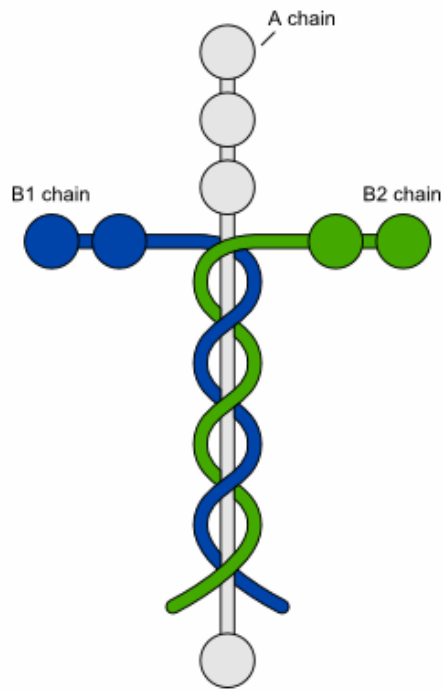
The Supremacy of Christ
