RECITATION

The Old Testament had a law: the Jews could beat a man no more than forty stripes (See Deuteronomy 25:3). The Jews used a long supple rod, and would beat a man no more than thirty-nine stripes; but who scourged Jesus? The Jews or the Romans?

The Romans did, and they had no such law. The Romans used a long leather strap attached to one handle; the whip was knotted with pieces of bone and lead. Sometimes a man died from the scourging or flogging.* Though we do not know how many horrendous stripes they laid on Jesus, we do know His excruciating suffering included healing for every individual: by His stripes we are healed.
