## Warn the Wicked!

For the last couple of years, I have heard it said, and believed it myself, that God is going to "rescue His eagle"—that is, to save America and the rest of the world from corrupt and illegitimate governments that consistently oppose Godly values. I believe revival and prosperity is in the future for those who have trusted and served the Lord, as the wickedness currently being advocated by "liberal" politicians and broadcast by the major media outlets is overturned. As a nation, we are more than ready for JUSTICE in America, wondering if indeed it is coming and why it is taking SO long!

Then last week, I began to hear three words: "Warn the Wicked!" What I have been hearing before was certainly GOOD NEWS to believers, but BAD NEWS to the wicked people who hijacked our 2020 election, who support the abortion industry, who have abandoned Constitutional and Biblical values in favor of Socialist and Marxist ideologies. To be lost, all you have to do is spend your life in selfish pursuits, denying or ignoring the fact that you have sinned, and ignoring the fact that Jesus actually DIED on a cross to forgive you for all you have done. On the other hand, if you HAVE robbed a bank, or killed someone, or committed some other horrible acts, no matter how wicked you have been, Jesus really DIED on a cross, a blood sacrifice to pay for ALL of our sin and to forgive us for all we have done. Your wickedness and my own, no matter how bad we have been, can be forgiven, and our lives can be changed as if we had never sinned! There are two steps: 1. Confess our sin, 2. Believe that Jesus died for our sins and accept his forgiveness. When you accept Jesus, you are a NEW person! Your sins were washed away! You are starting a NEW life! Then, read the Bible, and ask the Lord to show you how this "new person" should be living!

Then I began to think about these people we are supposed to be warning. There are a lot of very nice people that I know who just don't spend their time thinking about the Lord or acknowledging what Jesus did for us at Calvary. Then again, there are some people who are NOT very nice. These people probably don't like me very much. In fact, they probably don't like me AT ALL! What is even worse, I probably don't like them very much either! One thing for sure: They aren't going to be reading THIS website about Bible verses, so I probably don't need to worry about them anyway!

OOPS! Now I'm beginning to sound like <u>Jonah</u>, the prophet in the Old Testament. God saw the terrible wickedness in Ninevah, He pronounced judgment and destruction on that city, and He called Jonah to go to Ninevah and preach repentance to the people there. Remember that the people of Ninevah were Assyrians, who were mortal enemies of the children of Israel. Jonah knew that if he went to Ninevah and preached to them, that the people would probably repent, that God would be merciful, and He would NOT destroy the city. Jonah certainly didn't want THAT to happen. The Ninevites were wicked, and they deserved to be punished and their city destroyed. So Jonah went in the OPPOSITE direction, running away from Ninevah and away from God! Running away from God NEVER ends well! Jonah boarded a ship, a storm arose, Jonah found himself thrown overboard, and swallowed by a LARGE fish. After three days in the belly of this fish, the Lord finally got through to him, and Jonah reluctantly went and preached a message of repentance to the Ninevites. Sure enough, just as Jonah predicted, the people repented by the hundreds of thousands, and God canceled the destruction of the city. Jonah was MAD and UNHAPPY!
