### SESSION ONE: REFLECT

LOOKING BACK ON 2025 WITH GRACE, NOT JUDGMENT

TEACHING FOCUS

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Reflection is observation, not punishment. God invites us to look back to gain wisdom, not shame. 2025 contained both growth and resistance, and both have value when viewed through God's truth.

God does not measure your past by perfection but by formation. Where you see loss or delay, God sees instruction. Reflection allows us to close a season cleanly, so we do not carry unresolved weight into what's next.

## **SESSION TWO: REVIVE**

### **RESTORING WHAT WAS INTERRUPTED**

#### **TEACHING Focus**

**My Notes:**

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Revival does not begin with motion; it begins with alignment. You can be obedient and still exhausted. God does not rebuke depletion — He restores it.

Burnout is not always disobedience. Often, it is responsibility without renewal. Revival is God reawakening what has been running on empty.

#### **SCRIPTURE**

“I will restore to you the years that the locust has eaten... You shall eat in plenty and be satisfied, and praise the name of the Lord your God, who has dealt wondrously with you.” — Joel 2:25–26

“To give them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness.” — Isaiah 61:3

TEACHING FOCUS

**My Notes:**

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You cannot build a future while operating from a former version of yourself. Identity determines decisions, boundaries, and expectations.

God is not calling you to fix who you were — He is revealing who you are becoming.

### SCRIPTURE

“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here.” — 2 Corinthians 5:17

I break agreement with insecurity, people-pleasing, and the need to be validated by visibility.

I choose alignment over approval.

I choose purpose over performance.

I declare that my past prepares me but does not imprison me.

My experiences refine me, they do not limit me.

I agree with heaven's perspective of me.

I receive God's definition of my identity.

I walk forward with clarity, confidence, and peace.

I am becoming.

I am aligned.

I am free.

In Jesus' name, Amen.

## 10 DECLARE & DECREE STATEMENTS — 2026 WOMEN'S RETREAT

### 1. Declaration of Alignment

I declare and decree that my life is aligned with the will of God.

My steps are ordered, my decisions are clear, and my path is established.

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### 2. Declaration of Restoration

I declare and decree that everything interrupted in my life is being restored by God.

No season was wasted. No delay was permanent.

God is restoring strength, clarity, confidence, and peace.

 “*I will restore to you the years that the locust has eaten.*” — Joel 2:25

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### 3. Declaration of Identity

I declare and decree that I am not who I was — I am who God says I am.

Old labels are broken. False identities are released.

I walk forward as a new creation with renewed purpose.

 “*If anyone is in Christ, she is a new creation.*” — 2 Corinthians 5:17

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### 4. Declaration of Authority

I declare and decree that I walk in God-given authority.

I take back my voice, my confidence, and my boundaries.

I do not shrink. I do not apologize for alignment.

 “*I have given you authority... over all the power of the enemy.*” — Luke 10:19

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### 5. Declaration of Peace

I declare and decree that peace governs my mind, my body, and my decisions.

I move at God's pace, not the world's demand.

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## 6. Declaration of Consistency

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## 7. Declaration of Wisdom

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## 8. Declaration of Provision
