Application Form for Outstanding Graduate Student

Purpose:

This annual University of Idaho GPSA award was created to honor outstanding achievements of three Masters and three Doctoral students. Each of the six honorees will receive a framed certificate and a \$500 cash award.

Overall Eligibility:

Nominee must be a graduate student, registered through Moscow-campus of University of Idaho (either full-time or part-time). Individuals can either nominate themselves or be nominated by other students/staff/faculty members. *Nominees can receive this award only once as a graduate student (under each category) at the University of Idaho.*

Categorical Eligibility:

Master's students: The nominee must have completed at least two semesters at the University of Idaho.

For Doctoral students: The nominee must have completed at least three semesters at the University of Idaho.

Selection Criteria:

The selection committee considers academic performance, co-curricular, and extra-curricular achievements during graduate studies at the University of Idaho. *Only accomplishments while being a registered graduate student at the University of Idaho will be considered.* Specific factors include:

Master's Students:

- i. Must be in a good academic standing.
- ii. Performance in their coursework (GPA)
- iii. Honors and Awards, work experience, paper/poster presentations, publications (research, extension, or general), creative work, organizational service, and leadership achievements.

Doctoral Students:

- i. Must be in a good academic standing.
- ii. Publications (order of authorship will be considered), paper/poster presentations at professional conferences
- iii. Organizational service, professional association, work experience in their respective fields, regional and/or national recognition in their respective fields

Requirements:

- i. Filled-in application form.
- ii. Letter of Support from a faculty member at the University of Idaho.
