#### From the Pastor's Desk

To All Who Long for Freedom!

This Sunday marks the 245<sup>th</sup> anniversary of American Independence. On that first day of American Independence the American colonists unanimously signed a declaration making known their intention of severing all ties with English tyranny.

The first words of this declaration read as follows: "When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness".

Freedom has been defined as the right of enjoying all of the privileges of membership or citizenship, the right or the power to engage in certain actions without control or interference.

The Bible says we as Christians have freedom in Christ, and that it is for freedom that Christ has set us free (Galatians 5:1). We have the freedom to believe in Jesus and to love His Word. But what, exactly, is this freedom that we have in Jesus? Even apart from Jesus we all have the natural freedom to make decisions and choices and to think and say most anything we want. Our freedom in Jesus is meant to be a different kind or expression of freedom which is meant to represent the One who loved us and gave Himself up for us.

### From the Pastor's Desk (con't)

Jesus said in John 8:31-32, "If you remain in My word, then you are truly My disciples. You shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free."

So, what exactly does Jesus set us free from?

First, He sets His people free from the "law of sin and death."

Second, He sets His people free from bondage to sin.

Third, He sets His people free from the burden of the Law.

Forth, He sets His people free from a self-glorifying past.

Fifth, He sets His people free from the veil which separated a Holy God from sinful man.

Finally, He sets His people free from self-serving motives.

I believe that these six are among the most important freedoms that those who have been Spiritually born again have been indeed set free from. Jesus declared, "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed" (John 8:36).

While many people may be on the road during this special weekend, I hope you will find time to be with us in Worship whether in person or by Zoom as we give thanks to the One who secures our freedom as Americans, as well as the freedom we enjoy by being set apart out of all the peoples on the earth to be a people for His own special possession.

Since it is the first Sunday of the month we are also looking forward to partaking of the Lords Supper together.

The Lamplighter is getting a make-over!


