Pastor's Letter

To All Who Belong to the Family of God,

This past Sunday Immanuel Union Church witnessed the Baptism of Ella Astra Buchanan as a non-communing member of our church. Unfortunately for all who attended in person, the church boiler for the Sanctuary wasn't working, and it was a cold 45° , so I had to cut some of my sermon, which was what I consider an important means of clarifying exactly what is taking place at the time of Baptism. The Westminster Larger Catechism correctly defines baptism this way: Baptism is a sacrament of the New Covenant, in which Christ has ordained the washing with water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, to be a sign and seal of being grafted into himself; of remission of sins by his blood and regeneration by his Spirit; and of adoption into his family and resurrection to everlasting life. By this the people baptized are solemnly admitted into the visible church and enter into an open and professed engagement to be wholly and only the Lord's.

Therefore, baptism is not meant to be administered to people outside of the visible church, because they are still estranged from the covenant of promise until that time they profess their own faith in Jesus Christ alone. This new life is one that lives for Him, since He first loved us and gave Himself up for us. As we are grafted into His Body, we not only have a deep love for Him, but we love being like Him as we live in obedience to His will, since He is now our rightful King. Since we acknowledge Him as our Lord and Savior, we then do all within our God given ability to raise our Children honoring Him as their Lord and Savior as well.

So, Ella was received into our church on the basis of a faith professed by her mother Katie Buchanan, as well as her grandmother Nancy Myers. I explained the importance of building upon that baptism in living our lives in a way which is honoring to God and making Him the biggest priority in our lives. This is the fulfillment of our Covenant keeping God to all who give Him Honor. We see this throughout the Scriptures. A good example of this is found in Exodus 34:6-7 God, Himself testified to His covenant people, "The LORD passed before him and proclaimed, "The LORD, the LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness, keeping steadfast love for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin, but who will by no means clear the guilty, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children and the children's children, to the third and the fourth generation."

When we make a public declaration of faith before God and His people, it is important for us to do all within our power to fulfill it so that everything ultimately will go well with us and our children all the days of our life. It is important that we live soberly, always being thankful, as we consider the nature of our Baptism and the purposes for which Jesus established it. We should keep in mind the privileges and benefits which God provides, as He fulfills His side of the Covenant contract. This is revealed and sealed by Him, as we keep in mind our part of the Covenant which is declared by our solemn vows to fulfill it with God's help and enablement. Therefore, it is vital that we live humbly as we consider the corruption of our sinful nature and our propensity to stray from the one who loved us so much, that He gave His own Son as a sacrifice in order to bring us into this Covenantal relationship in the first place.

Pastor's Letter (2)

We should do all that is earthly possible in fighting for faith, on our part as well as on the part of our children who we represent in this covenant. Keep in mind what the Lord our God has done for us, as we continually keep in mind that He has pardoned our sin and provides for us the countless blessings sealed to us in this sacrament.

He enables His faithful ones to live lives as more than conquerors, as we get our strength from the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, because it is He into whom we are baptized. As a result of His death and resurrection, our sinful nature has been put to death. We now through His grace have been made alive with Him, so we seek to live by faith a life He has set apart for righteous living.

After all, when we are baptized, we give up our old selves on behalf of Jesus, and we are grafted into the family of God who enables us to walk in brotherly love with one another since we are baptized by the same Spirit into the one body which is the Body of Jesus Christ.

So we welcome Ella Astra Buchanan into our Immanuel Union Church family and please pray with me that God will work in her life and bring her to full faith in Jesus in His time.

I will close with Psalm 71:18 which is an encouraging word for all of us who feel that we are too old to make a difference in the lives of our children or even grandchildren. So even to old age and gray hairs, O God, do not forsake me, until I proclaim your might to another generation, your power to all those to come.

From the Church Council

The Council met last week and basically focused on upcoming events. The Church Holiday Fair, of course, was first and foremost. We are praying, and asking you to pray with us, for a successful outcome this year, even in the midst of the continuing Pandemic, and that people will see our love for Jesus and for them and be drawn to IUC. We will not have a lunchroom as we have in the past, because we don't want to check vaccination cards; but we still will have one of our favorite tables for homemade baked goods and chowder. We also will have many great raffle baskets with many goodies that are always a favorite- thanks to DonnaMarie for her creativity and willingness to take on that job. We also have household treasures, jewelry and handbags, plants, Christmas decorations, books, tools and toys. There truly is something for everyone! For those of you who live on Staten Island, we would love to see you on the 13th and for those who have volunteered to help with setup, to work the fair or assist with clean up- thank you so much! If you have ANY availability to help, please do- basically set up hours are Tuesday-Friday 8-5 and 7-9 p.m., you can always call Gina to confirm someone will be there when you want to volunteer! We are grateful to Bunny Matthius for the hours of organization she has spent in preparing the "goods" for the fair, and to her and Nancy Myers who are spearheading and leading the fair endeavor. We are so thankful to God for their efforts and ministry to IUC.

The Council also discussed our continuing fundraising campaign, and our ultimate goal of raising \$50,000.00. As of this writing, God has provided and blessed the Church with about \$19,000, of which \$11,000 is still needed for the boiler repair. During the flooding a couple of months ago, our gym floor was also damaged, and tiles have been cracking as well as coming up. Our gym is used weekly and is a source of income for our Church, so our sexton John has been working diligently to put them back where they belong, but ultimately, that too will need to be redone. John has also worked to put back down the bathroom floor in the ladies room which also came up as a result of the flooding. Having a beautiful and old historic sacred site is such a blessing, but currently it is a source of needed updating and repairs. The boiler, of course, remains a priority (see Pastor's letter about the temperature on Sunday in the Sanctuary), but there is a long list of needed repairs that are looming right behind the boiler repair. If you haven't donated to our Boiler/Repair Fund, would you consider it? Every dollar counts and no dollar donated is too small!

Barbara Matthius

I was first introduced to Immanuel Union Church when my family relocated to Fiske Avenue. That was 1935. I attended Sunday School, and, was later married at Immanuel. Today, I am the longest living member of the Church, and its unofficial "historian"!

Immanuel has always been an important part of my spiritual life, as well as providing an opportunity for social activity and community service.

As a youth, I was a member of the basketball team. At 18-years old, Pastor Link appointed me a nursery caretaker. Later, as an adult, I took an active role in the church, bringing energy, enthusiasm and new ideas for the Church to thrive and prosper.

In my "younger years", I was a member of The Third Ring---a group of women who socialized and supported the Church's many functions, including plays and musicals put on by our members. Sadly, over time this group disbanded. As the Couples Club transitioned to Adult Fellowship, I became actively involved in that group.

I served as both member, and Chairperson of the Church Board, as well as, Board of Trustees. During this time, I introduced supporting disadvantaged families in Appalachia by conducting a drive to send Christmas gifts to children, initiated a "backpack drive" to provide backpacks with much needed school supplies, instituted "dinner theaters"—both making and serving dinner at Church before heading to the latest Wagner College theater production, introduced the tradition of the Christ Candle following a trip to Austria's St. Stephen's Cathedral in Vienna, served as Chairperson of the Fair, introducing and making festive decorations which are still in use today, introduced the "\$500 super raffle", made bread for the Thanksgiving altar each year, made homemade pickles and jams as part of "Country Store" display at the Fair, and became actively involved in the baked goods table at the Fair, eventually assuming managing the table for many years with my homemade cakes and breads. As a member of the Staten Island Garden Club, I planted flowers around our sign to attract passersby.

At 95, my relationship with Immanuel has been a long and gratifying one filled with many fond memories and wonderful friendships.

Due to the loss of income from our annual Church Fair, craft and vendor shows, and donations from the many groups, organizations, and gatherings, our coffers are in dire need of support to replace the boiler in our aged heating system, and to make much-needed repairs to our historic stained glass, and roof easements.

As an update, we are pleased to announce that late last year, Immanuel Union Church was recognized as an historic sacred site in the United States, and is now listed on the National Historic Registry.
