Pastor's Letter

Dear Servants of the Most High,

Due to covid we will not sell food from the kitchen. We will be praying for warmer temps so that we can have the doors and windows open in the gym so that everyone will feel safe. Please note the dates listed in the Lamplighter, especially that of the Congregational Budget Meeting to approve the proposed 2022 budget which will be on November 21st immediately after the Church service in the Sanctuary. This will be our first in person and zoom meeting- so please attend either in person or on zoom if you are a Church member. Also, due to people being on zoom and sound probably being an issue, the person running the meeting or whoever is moderating will repeat any comments or questions that are asked in the sanctuary so those on zoom can be involved. Please be patient, this will be a learning curve for us all.

The Council's goal continues to be that we keep as much of our Church traditions as we can during the pandemic, so we will do a canned food drive on Thanksgiving Sunday, as well as having poinsettias for Christmas, look for an order form next month in the Lamplighter or call the Church office to order yours.

As Covid cases are rising we pray we can get through the holidays in our "new normal" but as normal as possible. We continue to watch the numbers and mandates and will continue to have our congregations safety on the front burner.

We are thankful for Eugene Sorenson who continues to run our technology and sound for our service as well as on Zoom and for Diane Pillarella who plays for us all the way from Delaware. Technology really is amazing and we are thankful and blessed with two very giving servants who minister to us weekly. Thank you Eugene and Diane!

As an update, we are pleased to announce that late last year, Immanuel Union Church was recognized as an historic sacred site in the United States, and is now listed on the National Historic Registry. We have initiated an appeal to raise \$50,000 to replace our heating system, and any extra raised for stained glass repair and roof easements. We hope you will consider contributing to this worthy undertaking.
