The goal of the Council is for the safety of everyone in our congregation, as well as those who rent the building from us, so please know that your safety is our priority.

We continue to offer in person services, as well as on Zoom every Sunday (See link in Lamplighter). It has been wonderful to have former members who moved away from Immanuel join us via Zoom, and we welcome you to join us if you aren't local and can't be with us in person. We are extremely thankful for Diane Pillarella (our former in-person pianist) who volunteers her time and talents in playing for us and leads the songs every Sunday all the way from Delaware, technology is surely a wonderful thing! We are including new songs into our rotation of hymns and Diane is always more than willing to learn them and play them so it is easy for us to learn them as well. Eugene Sorenson is our technical director and he has been such a blessing to our Church since Covid closure and we were forced to have Church online. Thank you to both of these special and important people for their sacrificial weekly ministry to our Church, we could not do it without you! We have added a new part to our service called "prayers of the people" which Leslie Baldini is in charge of. We have initiated an appeal to raise \$50,000 to replace our heating system, and any extra raised for stained glass repair and roof easements. We hope you will consider contributing to this worthy undertaking.
