## Pastor's Letter

To All Who Genuinely Profess Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ,

Several weeks ago, we began to focus upon the Book of Acts. Yes, the book of Acts will give us a better understanding of who the Holy Spirit is and His impact upon the church of Jesus Christ. Yet, a proper focus on the Book of Acts should also inspire evangelism within the local church.

Acts highlights the power of the Holy Spirit in the early church's evangelistic efforts, which believers can apply in their own evangelistic endeavors.

One thing that stands out about the beginnings of the NT church, is the supernatural growth that the Spirit of God brought through the life and ministry of the local church. For example, after Peter stepped forth and boldly proclaimed the Gospel of Jesus Christ over 3000 members were added to the 120 on just that first day.

Some examples of this continual growth are found in:

Acts 2:47, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved.

Acts 5:14,, And all the more believers in the Lord, multitudes of men and women, were constantly added to their number,

Acts 6:1, Now at this time while the disciples were increasing in number, a complaint arose on the part of the Hellenistic Jews against the native Hebrews, because their widows were being overlooked in the daily serving of food.

Acts 6:7, The word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith.

Acts 9:31, So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria enjoyed peace, being built up; and going on in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it continued to increase.

Acts 11:21, And the hand of the Lord was with them, and a large number who believed turned to the Lord.

Acts 11:24, Barnabus was a good man, and full of the Holy Spirit and of faith. And considerable numbers were brought to the Lord.

Acts 16:5, So the churches were being strengthened in the faith, and were increasing in number daily.

## Pastor's Letter (con't)

Acts describes the dramatic impact of the gospel, showing how it changed the world and established the church. This should inspire all who call on the name of Jesus to see the potential for evangelism to change our neighborhood and beyond.

By studying the Book of Acts, believers can gain a deeper understanding of how the early church spread the gospel and can apply these lessons to their own evangelistic efforts.

My desire is to equip you with the tools to confidently share the gospel in a clear and meaning way. These tools provide opportunities to answer questions, engage in deeper discussions, and reinforce biblical truths. This section explores ten valuable tools that can aid believers in spreading the gospel effectively.

Fear and rejection are common struggles in evangelism, but they should not prevent us from fulfilling our part in the great commission. God has called every believer to share the gospel, and He provides the strength and wisdom we need to do so. By relying on His promises, praying for boldness, and taking small steps, evangelism becomes less intimidating.

We should not take rejection of the Gospel personally it is their own response to God grace. The goal is not to convince but to faithfully share the message and trust God with the results. Evangelism is an act of obedience, and every effort matters. Keep sharing the gospel with confidence, knowing that God is at work.

So, with this in mind I'd like to invite everyone who genuinely cares about the future of Immanuel Union Church to take part in learning how to share your faith with friends, family and neighbors so that God can use IUC as a Gospel light to burn brightly in Westerleigh. We will begin this during the Sunday School hour, both in person in the Parlor and on Zoom beginning on October 19<sup>th</sup> at 9 a.m.
