### Pastor's Letter

Spring Greetings to All of You,

In 1998 Burger King published a full-page advertisement in *USA Today* announcing the introduction of a new item to their menu: a "Left-Handed Whopper" specially designed for the 32 million left-handed Americans. According to the advertisement, the new whopper included the same ingredients as the original Whopper (lettuce, tomato, hamburger patty, etc.), but all the condiments were rotated 180 degrees for the benefit of their left-handed customers.

The following day Burger King issued a follow-up release revealing that although the Left-Handed Whopper was a hoax, thousands of customers had gone into restaurants to request the new sandwich. Simultaneously, according to the press release, "many others requested their own 'right-handed' version."

This story was of course the result of an elaborate April Fool's Day prank. All of us at one time or another in moments of gullible weakness have fallen victim to an April Fool's Day prank. Often it comes because of forgetting what date it is. We are told a story which we believe, only to hear the words "April Fools" yelled in a loud enthusiastic voice.

It is difficult to trace how April Fool's Day originated, but it seems to relate to the date of the New Year under the Julian calendar.

Before the introduction of the Gregorian calendar by Pope Gregory I in 1582 AD, New Years Day was on March 25th with celebrations which lasted for about eight days! These ended on April 1st, possibly at 12 noon. This may be why trick playing is supposed to cease at 12 noon on April 1st.

The custom appears to have originated in France, where people traditionally exchanged New Year gifts on April 1st. After the adoption of the new calendar, many people held on to the old traditions despite ridicule by the more progressive members of society. They became the butts of jokes, which gradually extended to the whole community playing tricks on each other such as sending apprentices on useless errands.

Ordinarily when we apply the word, fool to someone we are saying that this person is somehow mentally deficient. When the word, fool is used in the Scriptures, most of the time it speaks of someone who has a moral problem.

For instance, in Ps 14:1 we read: *The fool says in his heart, "There is no God." They are corrupt, their deeds are vile; there is no one who does good.* 

This means that when someone devotes their life to doing that which is corrupt and vile, they are making a declaration that as far as they are concerned, "God does not exist" and therefore they are not living in a wise way, but rather in a life fit for a fool.

### Pastor's Letter (con't)

In 1 Corinthians 1:18 Paul is declaring the same thing when he speaks of the cross of Jesus Christ. Most people, when they hear of the preaching of the cross, look at it as being dull, drab and moronic. They think that a man who was executed over 2000 years ago for the crime of insurrection, in a city and culture that is completely foreign to them, should have any impact in the way they live their life as a 21st Century person is at the least ridiculous.

Paul goes onto to say that one's reaction to the preaching of the cross of Jesus Christ, diagnosis a person's spiritual condition. In another words, a person's reaction to the proclamation of the cross of Jesus Christ reveals whether he or she is living according to the power of God for their salvation or living as a fool fit for destruction.

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

In the wake of this Easter season, let us use this time to contemplate and reflect as to whether you truly believe that what happened at Calvary was really the greatest event in the history of the world and the greatest event in the history of your life, or just some April Fool's Day joke.

Remember the rest of the story. That is Jesus was crucified by man for insurrection, but three days later vindicated by God through resurrection.

The Planning Committee continues to meet the second Thursday of the month to provide ongoing support and direction for the Council.

As the first quarter of the year comes to a close, the Committee is pleased to sponsor Immanuel's "Spring Awakening" as we welcome each other back to worship, fellowship, and, church activities. A Silver Tea Reception offering lite fare will be provided immediately following our church service. Come back to church, stay for a snack, and enjoy some fellowship as we re-engage.

A recap of the Committee's first quarter progress includes:

- Successful dollar sale—the February dollar sale allowed us to reduce our clutter and bring in additional revenue. Between sold items, raffles, and kitchen offerings, the event realized approximately \$1,000. And, the lounge looks a lot neater!
- March Vendor Fair—the March vendor fair was a sold out event with over 40 vendors.
  Despite the inclement weather, the gym was bustling with shoppers. This year table prices were increased by \$5 to \$40, the first increase since inception. The event realized \$2,500 with table donations, church table, and the incredible efforts of the kitchen comprised of Donna Tecarr and her granddaughters Marissa and Elsie.
- Ladies Room Refresh—the ladies room is undergoing a much needed overhaul! Windows have been washed and new curtains donated. New flooring is on the horizon.

#### On the horizon:

- Planning is underway for the April Book Sale (April 29) and June Garage Sale (June 17).
- To provide a head start to fall, contracts for the **autumn and holiday vendor fairs** have been distributed to existing vendors to be followed by a broader mailing.
- Church facility clean-up day—while events and rentals are very welcomed, foot traffic and
  usage take a toll on the building and facility. Additionally, with so many "in and out", it impacts
  organization and tidiness. A dedicated day for "spring cleaning" is being considered. While
  the scouts will be assisting with outdoor clean-up, volunteers are needed to help organize and
  eliminate some of the "dust bunnies."
- Discussion is underway for holiday concert events to be held in our sanctuary—so "stay tuned" as these plans unfold.
