Pastor's Letter

Greeting to all whose hope in the Lord Jesus Christ,

Once again, we are coming to that special time of the year when we commemorate the wonder of the incarnation. Sarah's FIL (the Pastor of the Church) is now discharged, and when Sarah went to the hospital, Leslie left for Sarah's to take care of the baby and help Jon with the kids. Sarah was just put on a ventilator 2 days ago, and now I REALLY have to fight the "why us, Lord".

I'd like to share a verse that we do not associate with Christmas, but I believe it is relevant, especially in light of life's uncertainties.

John 10:10 -The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.



This month we were able to fix the boiler with the donated monies that had come in so far (thanks to all of you for your generous donations). Thanks also to Paul Blissenbach who suggested his friend who owns Quinlan. The quote they gave was almost \$10,000 less than the other 2 companies that put in a bid. God was gracious to give us enough money to cover the boiler (thank you to all those who donated), so those of you who will be in person on Sunday, the Sanctuary will be warm and have heat! Praise the Lord.

The other exciting news is that there is a Church plant out of Brooklyn, Zion Church, that is interested in holding services at IUC. At first they were interested in the Sanctuary, but currently they seem more focused on holding service on Sunday morning in the gym. Once approved by the council they would be putting in lighting, sound and even Air Conditioning which will really benefit our Church because the gym would become rentable space during the heat of the summer. They would also be fully upgrading the nursery.

The Council also decided to move the Christmas Eve service to Zoom instead of in person. Since cases are rising so much and Churches are getting hit so hard with superspreading Delta, we just thought it best to move to Zoom. We are still watching cases and we do keep the option on the table to go fully to zoom if necessary. We will of course keep you all informed.

While we have all experienced many shops, restaurants, and businesses closing, Immanuel is committed to staying the course as we find our way back from the pandemic into a more promising future.

Due to the loss of income from our annual Church Fair, craft and vendor shows, and donations from the many groups, organizations, and gatherings, our coffers are in dire need of support to replace the boiler in our aged heating system, and to make much-needed repairs to our historic stained glass, and roof easements.

Whether you are an active member, live at a distance and are now part of our extended church family, or are a neighborhood friend of the Church, we're sure that you have fond memories of time spent at Immanuel. As an update, we are pleased to announce that late last year, Immanuel Union Church was recognized as an historic sacred site in the United States, and is now listed on the National Historic Registry. We have initiated an appeal to raise \$50,000 to replace our heating system, and any extra raised for stained glass repair and roof easements. We hope you will consider contributing to this worthy undertaking.
