### Pastor's Letter

To All Who Long For His Appearance,

We are quickly approaching the end of '22. If you are anything like me, the things we hoped would happen didn't, and the things we never thought would happen did. In all of this, I'm comforted by remembering that God is still on His throne and in full control. In other words, His purposes are being fulfilled on a moment-by-moment basis, for His glory and for my good. How sad it is that there are so many people who do not have this comforting assurance. Though we may be tempted to doubt this from time to time as we look at our circumstances, yet God sits firmly enthroned in the heavens. We know this because God became flesh and dwelt among us. Use your time to bring Him glory this month. What is most important in our lives is always evidenced by the priority which we give to it. Evaluate your priorities. Do your friends and family members see your relationship with Jesus as the most important of all your relationships? They may never tell you this, but I assure you they are analyzing your life to see whether He really is. Oh, I pray that together we as a congregation can love and long for the day of His appearing!

Whether you worship with us in-person or via Zoom, or simply enjoy Immanuel's daily bell chimes and events, you are no doubt aware of the toll that the COVID pandemic has taken on many businesses, organizations and institutions. Sadly, Immanuel Union has also been negatively impacted.

While we have all experienced many shops, restaurants, and businesses closing, Immanuel is committed to staying the course as we find our way back from the pandemic into a more promising future. Due to the loss of income from our annual Church Fair, craft and vendor shows, and donations from the many groups, organizations, and gatherings, our coffers are in dire need of support to replace the boiler in our aged heating system, and to make much-needed repairs to our historic stained glass, and roof easements.

Whether you are an active member, live at a distance and are now part of our extended church family, or are a neighborhood friend of the Church, we're sure that you have fond memories of time spent at Immanuel. As an update, we are pleased to announce that late last year, Immanuel Union Church was recognized as an historic sacred site in the United States, and is now listed on the National Historic Registry. It is our goal to continue to provide the meaningful spiritual guidance and activities to our church members, extended members, and the broader Westerleigh community into perpetuity.

We have initiated an appeal to raise \$50,000 to replace our heating system, and any extra raised for stained glass repair and roof easements. We hope you will consider contributing to this worthy undertaking.
