

From the Pastor's Desk

To All Who Long For His Appearance,

We're quickly approaching the end of 2020 and if you're anything like me you'll be glad to see it go. For me to say this year has been marked by the unexpected would be an understatement. Yet, in all of this craziness, be comforted by the fact that God is still on His throne and He is in complete control over whatsoever comes to pass. In other words, His purposes are being fulfilled on a moment by moment basisfor own His glory and for the good of those He has called to love His Son Jesus. It is because of that fact, the emotion that 2020 has evoked within me the most is sadness. I'm sad that while we are all experiencing the same challenges, the same sorrows, the same fears, there are many people who do not know who to turn to for abiding peace and comfort in the midst of hardships.

"Fear not, for behold I bring you glad tidings of great joy! For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, which is Christ the Lord."

What wondrous good news was received by the shepherds outside Bethlehem on that first Christmas Eve so very long ago. Since mankind's fall into sin, the people of God hoped they would be the ones to hear the angel's proclaim the message of *glad tidings of great joy*. If all these temporal trappings are what instills *glad tidings of joy* in you then you've been betrayed, because they are hollow and will disappoint since they are now inaccessible, BUT if your hope is in the one whom Joseph named *Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins,* then hope and joy spring eternal.

Though our circumstances may tempt us to doubt, remember that God is still siting firmly enthroned in the heavens. He has given us Jesus who is the only means of abiding joy and peace in life.

This means that joy and peace in life does not depend upon our circumstances or people, but firmly upon the God who purchased you with the very life's blood of His only Son.

This Christmas season, please join me as I pray that we will keep our eyes fixed on Jesus. He is the risen Lord! He is the one who has promised to never leave us or forsake us! He is the one who has promised to be with us till the end of the age! He is the one who can never disappoint! He is the one who will return for His people in triumph!

Let the final words of Paul define your life as well, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the course, I have kept the faith; in the future there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day; and not only to me, but also to all who have loved His appearing." (2 Timothy 4:7-8)

I pray that all of us can be longing for that as a church, and loving the idea of His imminent return!

May God protect you and your family and richly bless you with the fullness of the presence of Jesus this Christmas season.


From the Church Council
