From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings In The Name of Jesus Christ,

Late one Valentine's Day, a young man staggered into a bakery just before it was about to close. The man came in from the pouring rain and was soaked from head to toe. "Am I glad you're still open," the man exclaimed. "I've been looking all over town for the chocolate doughnuts she wants. I've been walking in the rain searching for these for the past three hours. And finally, I find them just as I was about to give up." The cashier wrapped the young man's order and then asked, "Are these for your mother?" "Are you crazy," he laughed. "Do you think my mother would send me out on a night like tonight? . . . And do you think I would go?"

February has been called the month for lovers. Even though February possess the bleakest days of winter, it is a great time to celebrate the light of Christian love. Valentine's Day infuses this time of the year with a spark in what would otherwise be a dreary month. The stores adorned with the bright colors of pink and red act as reminders of the importance of the matters of the heart. It is a great time to give and receive Valentines because they act as a reminder about how great it is to love and to be loved.

I am sure that we all remember in grade school what a special day Valentine's Day was. I can remember how important it was to buy enough paper valentines for the whole class so that each student received one. I also remember the awkwardness of being smitten with a girl in my class named "Maria." I remember being so intimidated by her looks and popularity that I anxiously awaited the arrival of Valentine's Day. The reason is that I wanted to send her a special Valentine with a special message that revealed something that I was too intimidated to say to her face. I felt that this card would be able to communicate my feelings in a safe way, why, because I didn't sign it. I just left it on her desk and watched her face as she read it.

Cupid is not a character you will find in your Bible, but Valentine was a Christian saint in the 3rd century after Christ, when the church was young and before Rome became a Christian empire. In refusing to worship the emperor, Valentine was put into prison and sentenced to die. The daughter of the jailer, however, befriended him and cheered him amid his prison gloom. Just before his death, he wrote the young woman a note, thanking her for her friendship, assuring her that he would love her even after death. And he signed it "Your Valentine" (legend has it that he even cut "curious devices" into the note--the first paper lace?). And so began the association of "love" with the day of Valentine's martyrdom.

I really believe that romantic love, which is erotic at its core, is radically different from Christian love. Romantic love is ordinarily based upon feelings. These feeling change and a love that is based upon feelings will change as well. What I mean to say is that if your love for a person is based solely upon how you feel about some aspect of that person, when that aspect changes your feelings will change as well.

For instance as I consider "Maria," by today's standard, I wonder what it was that caused me to be so attracted and so intimated by her. What I mean to say is that she wasn't a very nice person; in fact she was spoiled and conceited. These are things that I really dislike in a person, today. And to be perfectly honest with you, she wasn't all that pretty by my more mature standard of prettiness such as the beauty I behold in my wife.

From the Pastor's Desk (con't)

I use this to illustrate that when our feelings for someone is based upon intense desires or passions, and those desires or passions change all that remains is the absence of love. The love which Paul calls us to embody in 1 Corinthians 13 is the love of covenant commitment, one which we choose and will into being, rather than merely "fall into."

Therefore, as the redeemed people of God, we should make it a matter of the will to love one another deeply from the heart. Not because any of us deserve it but because love is the glue that holds the Church of Jesus Christ together.




Bible Studies
