### From the Pastor's Desk

To All Who Seek For Greater Intimacy With Their Creator,

A preacher inquired of a little boy, "Do you say your prayers at night, little boy?" The boy responded, "Yes, sir." "And do you always say them in the morning too?" "No, sir," responded the boy, "I ain't scared in the daytime."

A funny story that has an all too truthful point, most of us only pray when we are plauged by fears.

In Colossians 4:2 Paul entreats us to, *Devote ourselves to prayer*. The word "be devoted to" occurs six times in the New Testament in relation to prayer. Acts 1:14, "These all with one mind were continually devoting themselves to prayer." Acts 2:42, "[The early church] were continually devoting themselves to . . . prayer." Acts 6:4, the apostles said they would devote themselves "to prayer and to the ministry of the word." Romans 12:12, "Rejoice in hope, persevere in tribulation, be devoted to prayer." Ephesians 6:18, "Pray at all times in the Spirit . . . with all perseverance."

So what does "Devote yourselves to prayer" mean? It simply means that we should pray often and pray regularly. Being "devoted to" prayer means that we are not haphazard or forgetful concerning prayer. It means we take steps to see that it is part of our regular life, the same way that eating and sleeping are.

This type a devotion involves taking steps. We see this by the next phrase in Colossians 4:2, "Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it." Keeping alert means that we take steps against being distracted. We take all of the necessary steps to stay awake and to stay at the task.

Let us consider two questions in regards to what it means be devoted to prayer.

**1. When should we pray?** In 1 Th 5:17 Paul exhorts us to, "pray continually." This may lead many of us to believe that we should have an integrated life with prayer saturating all we do. If that is your feeling then I say, amen to that. But it's still important to set apart a portion of your day to pray in solitude in order to focus upon quiet, UN-distracted communion with God.

**Why?** Because it's difficult to get deep with God on the run, merely fitting Him into the cracks of your day. But you can enjoy continual fellowship with God on the run if you have gone deep with God in the stillness of the season of prayer. Devotion prayer should act as a launching pad for having your whole day a walking conversation with God, so that you could offer up your desires to him hour by hour. Make that your aim. And the way to "**be devoted**" to prayer like that is to be devoted to regular daily times of solitude in prayer. You will go deep with him in the moments of quiet focus, and this depth will make God real and weighty in the rest of the day. So decide on a place and a time for this meeting of getting alone with God in prayer.

### From the Pastor's Desk (con't)

**2.** How Long should we pray? The historical records show that Martin Luther prayed 4 hours each day. One pastor remarked concerning Luther's extraordinary prayer life, "Luther prayed this much, not despite his busy life, but because only so could he accomplish his gigantic labors."

Most of us may not have as many gigantic labors as a Martin Luther to accomplish. Therefore it doesn't have to be one long duration of prayer. Instead it can be several planned shorter durations.

For example, there is the great example of Daniel. He was a high ranking political official in Babylon. He had enemies and they passed a law that no one could pray except to the king. Daniel 6:10 says, "Now when Daniel knew that the document was signed, he entered his house (now in his roof chamber he had windows open toward Jerusalem); and he continued kneeling on his knees three times a day, praying and giving thanks before his God, as he had been doing previously."

So not only do we see the courage and utter commitment of Daniel to pray in an open window when his life was threatened for it, but we see that he was "devoted" to it three times a day. I have found it very helpful at times in my life to set aside a time in the morning, at lunch and before or after supper. You go away by yourself and you read a small portion of Scripture and you pray and ask for God's help in that next third of the day.


Or you might do it differently. For example, the Psalmist in Psalm 119:164 tells us, "Seven times a day I praise You, because of Your righteous ordinances." This is all up to you.

What does matter is that we devote ourselves to prayer. We should be alert in prayer, and do whatever we have to do to see that we meet with our God in a focused way to hear from Him in his Word and to offer up our desires to Him in prayer.
