## From the Pastor's Desk

To All Who Long For The Nearness of God,

M. Night Shyamalan's movie *Wide Awake* is about a Catholic school boy's search for God. The boy, Joshua, specifically wants to find out whether or not his deceased grandfather is okay. Joshua and his friend Dave are sitting in a car in a garage having a discussion. Both are about 10 years old. Joshua says: "You know what, Dave? I'm going on a mission. A real mission."

"What kind of mission?" Dave asks.

"The kind where you're looking for something important," says Joshua.

"What are you gonna look for?"

"God."

"God?" Dave is incredulous. "What for?"

"I just want to talk to him."

"Why?"

"To make sure my grandpa is okay."

Dave thinks for a moment, then says: "Remember when you told me I was stupid for staring at that bug lamp on my porch for six hours hoping the purple light would have gamma rays and turn me into the Incredible Hulk so I could fight crime? Your mission is more stupid than that."

"Why?" Joshua asks.

"Cause you can't look for God."

"Why not?"

"Where in the world are you gonna look?"

James 4:8 exhorts us to "Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you". If you think of it, this must be one of the most amazing verses in the Bible. We can draw near to God? And God will draw near to us? Us, as we drink our coffee in the morning? Us, as we are in the midst of a difficult conversation? Us, as we feel ourselves losing patience with our children or our spouses? Us, when we become tired and grumpy by days end? Us, as we crawl into our beds at night? We can draw near to God? And God will draw near to us?

## From the Pastor's Desk (con't)

Almighty God in heaven wants us to draw near to Him, with the promise that He will draw near to us? If that's true, it must be one of the most wonderful truths in all of life.

What does it mean? "Draw near to God" means that God is inviting us to move close to Him. He is inviting us to commune with Him and enjoy Him and honor Him and draw strength from Him in our thoughts, in our hearts. He welcomes us into His special nearness: "Lord is near to all who call upon Him, to all who call upon Him in truth" (Psalm 145:18). Calling upon the Lord in truth, not in perfection, but in Christ, we have the assurance that we will never find God's door closed. He does not stand off at the other end of the universe. He loves to draw near to us.

He is ready right now for you, for me. When He sees even His prodigal children moving in His direction, He runs to meet them (Luke 15:20). You can draw near to God in praise, in need, in agony, in joy, in gratitude, in sin, in sadness, in doubt, in all the conditions of life.


Draw near to God with faith and repentance. Draw near to God through the finished work of Christ on the cross. Draw near to God with boldness, with reverence, and delight yourself in the overflowing pleasures of His presence.

Let this profound truth act as our daily resource. God says, "I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with him who is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, to revive the heart of the contrite" (Isaiah 57:15). "And you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry, and He will say, 'I am'" (Isaiah 58:9).

A. W. Tozer wrote in his book 'The Knowledge of the Holy', "Progress in the Christian life is exactly equaled to the growing knowledge we gain of the Triune God in personal experience." Here is how we can do that. **One,** remember that God has already opened the way into His presence through the cross of Christ. Our sin cannot keep us out. The way is clear, right now. **Two**, remember that the Bible is God's primary mechanism for displaying Himself to us, attracting us, inviting us nearer, encouraging us to come close. Read the Bible that way. Let His Word guide you there. **Three**, remember that our weekly worship time is, above all else, meant to be an encounter with the living God through Christ. Come to church in all of your need. He is enough for you. He will prove it, over and over, as we all draw near together. "Let us keep ourselves in the love of God" (Jude 21).
