### From the Pastor's Desk

To All Whose Hearts Long For Home,

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. Colossians 3:1-4

A trucker goes into a diner, and when the waitress comes over to take his order, he says, "I want eggs, toast, and coffee. But make the eggs uncooked, the toast burnt, and the coffee really strong and bad. And I want you to slam the food onto the table and yell at me." The waitress says "Why would you want me to something like that?" He replies, "I'm homesick."

Have you ever been homesick? Even in a beautiful place, surrounded by beautiful people, you have an urge to return home. I believe the saying is true, "home is where the heart is".

For the follower of Jesus, no matter what your actual home on earth may look like, there is a home that our hearts long for. The place called heaven. God has placed eternity in our hearts and our hearts will remain restless until that day we are called home.

Paul in 1 Corinthians 1: tells us, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him". Therefore, heaven is a difficult place to wrap our minds around. We understand the earth because we see it each and every day. We do real things with people who also see it. We live in a tangible body with site and sound and touch. But heaven sounds so surreal, so distant. It is hard to understand or imagine. Yet it's just as real as the place we presently call home.

God's plan is to one day bring all things in heaven and earth together under one head: Jesus Christ (Eph 1:10). Peter preached that Christ "must remain in heaven until the time for the final restoration of all things, as God promised long ago through his holy prophets" (Acts 3:21). God will not abandon His creation; He ultimately will restore it. He will restore lives. He will restore bodies. He will restore the home we presently inhabit.

One day there will be heaven on earth because a new world is coming. One day heaven will come down to earth. It will be out with the old and in with the new. There will be no more terminal diseases. No more accidents. No more disasters. No more funerals. No more breakdowns or breakups. No more suffering. God will make everything new.

We were created to know God. We were created to go to heaven. It is as if God has put a homing device within the hearts of His people, and we will only be fully satisfied after we see Him face to face. Are you ready to do that? Are you ready to go home?

Paul wrote these words about our heavenly dwelling place:

"Now we know that if the earthly tent [physical body] we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling." 2 Cor. 5:1-2

And who puts that desire in our hearts? Paul answers:

"Now it is God who has made us for this very purpose and has given us the Spirit as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come. Therefore we are always confident and know that as long as we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord. We live by faith, not by Sight."

2 Cor. 5:5-7

God designed us to be homesick for heaven. We will never be completely at peace until we share eternal life with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

I hope to see you all when we get home.
