From the Pastor's Desk

To All Who Reign With Christ While Living in a Fallen World,

Last Month we celebrated the Resurrection of our Savior. The Resurrection is critical to the Christian Message. Paul says, "if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins" (1 Cor. 15:17). The Resurrection gives meaning to the Crucifixion. If history ends with the Crucifixion, then our life ends at death. In a nutshell, we are forgiven because of Jesus' substitutionary death; but if He hasn't been raised, then we won't be either. We are forgiven for an eternal purpose. Paul further asserts that, "if only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men" (1 Cor. 15:19).

Consider, for instance, the actions of Peter following the Crucifixion. Perhaps you are familiar with his story. Peter is the disciple who boldly proclaimed to Jesus that he would never leave His side. He went so far as to say even if all the other disciples turned away from Jesus, "he would never." He said he would die before betraying Jesus. Jesus then stops Peter in his tracks and tells him, not only will he deny Him but that he would do it three times before the rooster crowed (daybreak). And we all know Peter did exactly that.

No doubt, he felt humiliated, embarrassed and ashamed. What Peter did next is exactly what most of us would do, he saturated himself in the mundane, for Peter that meant he went fishing. That is what he was doing when the risen Savior first encountered him. That is what he went back to after feeling the agony of personal loss and defeat. However, all was not lost! Jesus forgave and restored Peter. This restoration gave Peter a new sense of enthusiasm. When Jesus forgave Peter, He gave Peter a chance to confess his love. Three times Jesus asked Peter if he loved Him. Perhaps Jesus asked three times to reflect Peter's three denials. One thing we know for sure is with God failure is never final! Every one of us has failed God at various times and in various ways. And God, for the sake of His Son Jesus, offers to us forgiveness as well. There's no telling the things we can do if we really believe that.

In Peter's case he had a renewed spirit which spurred him on to serve Jesus faithfully for the rest of his life. Several months after being restored by Jesus, Peter went on to become just what Jesus promised him: a fisher of men. On the day of Pentecost, Peter preached a sermon where over 5000 men received Jesus as their Savior (although this number did not include the women or children who were present and received Jesus).


Peter thought all was lost, but it was not. In fact, all the disciples thought all was lost at the Crucifixion. It wasn't. Instead, what appeared to be the end was instead just the beginning. This was the beginning of true hope, true peace and eternal life.

Look around you. There is hopelessness. There is neediness. There is fear. There are people who have never tasted the forgiveness of God. These people live their lives trying to fill the void in their soul by saturating themselves in the mundane. And they face an eternity without God as well. Like Peter, God wants to restore you and use you as well, so that you may greatly impact the lives of these empty souls. Please pray and ask God to show you how he may use you.
