#### Pastor's Letter

To All Who Feel Drained of Joy,

This year Pentecost Sunday will fall on June 5th. This is a significant day to remember and appreciate in the history of the church. The word "Pentecost" basically means "50", and is doubly significant when one realizes that the Holy Spirit was poured out upon those early believers who were waiting in the upper room as they waited in obedience and expectancy. This was 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus Christ, and a full 40 days after he ascended back to Heaven as recorded by Luke in the Book of Acts.

While there is far more to this story than this brief letter, the main thing I want to emphasize is that they joyfully shared a spirit of expectancy waiting for the promise of Jesus to be fulfilled. I believe that we can approach every new day in the joyful power of "expectation," as we awake to the power that the Holy Spirit wants to reveal in our life. Therefore, I pray that you will use the month of May "expecting" great things from the Lord- even today!

He is the same God today, as He was on that great day, when the Holy Spirit was poured out on a waiting early church. What do you need Him to do in your life today? He still restores and heals broken lives! He still delivers from the clutches of sin! He still brings hope to the hopeless! He still pours out His Spirit upon expectant believers!

Isaiah 40:31 <sup>31</sup> but they who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint.

Today, as you read this do you find yourself weary and faint perhaps drained of any real joy, well the promise of Isaiah is for you.

In closing, we at IUC have traditionally emphasized Pentecost Sunday with the color red. Red is a visual reminder of the "tongues of fire" that empowered the apostles and others to proclaim the good news of Christ's resurrection in many languages to the crowds of pilgrims from many lands (Acts 2:3).

So, if you'd like to help in keeping that tradition alive, we will have red geraniums adorning the sanctuary on June 5<sup>th</sup> which are available for you to purchase in memory or honor of a loved one. You can contact Gina in the Church office to place your order. Also, feel free to wear something red to symbolize the inward work of the Holy Spirit in the life of our church.

# Order Your Geraniums





Whether you worship with us in-person or via Zoom, or simply enjoy Immanuel's daily bell chimes and events, you are no doubt aware of the toll that the COVID pandemic has taken on many businesses, organizations and institutions. Sadly, Immanuel Union has also been negatively impacted.

While we have all experienced many shops, restaurants, and businesses closing, Immanuel is committed to staying the course as we find our way back from the pandemic into a more promising future. Due to the loss of income from our annual Church Fair, craft and vendor shows, and donations from the many groups, organizations, and gatherings, our coffers are in dire need of support to replace the boiler in our aged heating system, and to make much-needed repairs to our historic stained glass, and roof easements.

Whether you are an active member, live at a distance and are now part of our extended church family, or are a neighborhood friend of the Church, we're sure that you have fond memories of time spent at Immanuel. As an update, we are pleased to announce that late last year, Immanuel Union Church was recognized as an historic sacred site in the United States, and is now listed on the National Historic Registry. We have initiated an appeal to raise \$50,000 to replace our heating system, and any extra raised for stained glass repair and roof easements. We hope you will consider contributing to this worthy undertaking.
