### Pastor's Letter

Greetings to all Who Desire to be Comforted,

One morning the boss of a certain company, before leaving for the office, had an argument with his wife. As a result, he was vicious to one of his employees. After what had been a difficult day the employee pulls into the driveway of his home where his young son was waiting anxiously to greet his dad with open arms. His dad walks by him with a grunt, causing the young lad to become so hurt and embittered that he takes it out on his dog by kicking the poor dog who had been faithfully resting at his side. The dog runs away and takes out his anger by biting a man arriving home from work, a man who just so happened to be the same person who began the furor in the first place, the boss.

For many of us, the chain of events that occurred from the events of October 7<sup>th</sup>, '23 to this Spring have been daunting to say the least. Doubts are dreary realities in seasons of sorrow. Like bees they sting at the soul!

If we wallow in the mire of despair we declare within or soul, "Christ is not mine!" The result is a bitter spirit which impacts all we encounter. Therefore, I write this article for those who long to be comforted.

In Matthew Chapter 5 verse 4 Jesus makes a clear declaration: He cries out to those who are hurting, "Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." He does not make this promise with uncertain terms like, for those who mourn, they may be, or they can be comforted but that they "will be comforted." What is this promise of assured comfort that He offers to those of us who are experiencing a time of mourning?

Job, was described in **Job 1:1 as being a person who was blameless and upright fearing God and shunning evil.** Yet this man became a man who was in need of the very comfort that Jesus offers. In a matter of a very short time Job lost almost everything: a very lucrative business, his servants, and his whole family except for his wife. And if that wasn't enough, his health failed as he dealt with the agony of painful boils all over his body, **ouch!** 

Any type of heartache can set us up for a crisis in faith. It often makes us bitter to the point where we question God's love and concern for us. When these conditions don't change: the world appears to be spinning out of control. We begin to focus on the appearance of dire circumstances it is easy to begin to lash out and curse God within.

So, how can we expect to find comfort from God when dealing with these feelings towards Him? In Job 19:25-27 we read what comforted Job; what gave him the ability to persevere in his season of despair, "I know that my Redeemer lives, and that in the end he will stand upon the earth. And after my skin has been destroyed, yet in my flesh I will see God; I myself will see him with my own eyes--I, and not another. How my heart yearns within me!"

## Pastor's Letter (con't)

Job never cursed God, instead he found comfort in knowing that despite all these things his redeemer still lived. In another words, although it may seem it, God was not dead!

The essence of Job's comfort lies in the little word "my"--"MY Redeemer"--and in the fact that his Redeemer lives. In Matt 5:4 Jesus is presenting Himself as that great solution to the soul that grieves. Hold on to the living Christ. Out of affliction we must earnestly seek to share in His comfort and then we can really enjoy Him.

What benefit is money while it remains clenched in our fist? What benefit is good health if you've emotionally given up on life? What benefit is family and friends if you keep them at a distance? So is a Redeemer who does not redeem me, an avenger who will never stand up for my blood, what benefit is there in that? It is only when we cry out to Him in the midst of our despair that He brings comfort. Do not rest content until by faith you can say, "**Yes, I cast myself upon my living Lord; and He is mine.**" You may be going through a difficult situation, as devastating as it may be, and you may be holding onto Him with a feeble hand and even half heartily say, "**He lives as my Redeemer.**" Even if you have faith as a grain of mustard seed, that little faith entitles you to say it.

But there is also another word here, which expresses Job's strong confidence: "I know." To say, "I hope so, I trust so" is comfortable, and there are thousands in the church of Jesus who hardly ever get much further. But to reach the essence of consolation where you say, "I know." Ifs, buts, and maybes are sure destroyers of peace and comfort.

But when I know that Jesus lives for me, then the darkness that I am experiencing becomes as light: **Even the night is light about me**. Surely if Job in the midst of his great crisis, and before the coming of Jesus Christ, could still find comfort in saying, **"I know that my redeemer lives,"** we should find comfort here as well.

Believe that whatever God may be bringing you through, He still is the living Redeemer, who truly wants to be your God and give to you an unspeakable joy.

May the God of all comfort provide boundless comfort to you, as you persevere in seasons of sorrow and despair,


