Pastor's Letter

To Those Who have Much to be Thankful For,

The epistle to the Hebrews is an encouraging letter that continually offers strength and comfort by demonstrating how Jesus is better than all of the symbols found in the OT. He then nears his conclusion by exhorting us in chapter 12, Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our "God is a consuming fire" (Vs 28-29).

"Let us be thankful". This is the time of year which is meant to realign our focus away from whatever circumstances we may be experiencing and onto the faithfulness of God.

I mean with the uncertain conditions of world affairs, as well as the struggling economy and add to that our various health problems, it is far more natural to focus upon what not to be thankful for.

In I Thess. 5:18 Paul exhorts us with these words, "In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you." If you are anything like me, there may be moments when you question whether you are living according to His perfect will. But for many of us, we would never consider that God's perfect will for us is found in the simple exercise of giving thanks. Perhaps the reason why is because being thankful is not an easy exercise.

I believe by now, many of us realize that our relationship with God is one in which He stretches His children to maturity. For those who don't have the "ideal life", it is easier to dwell upon the negatives than it is to focus upon the daily blessings we receive. So, in our grumbling we show contempt towards God for these blessings. When we grumble, we are no different than the children of Israel who never made it to the promised land.

Listen to the way the Psalmist writes about the events. In Psalm 106:21-25 we read, They forgot the God who saved them, who had done great things in Egypt, miracles in the land of Ham and awesome deeds by the Red Sea. So he said he would destroy them-had not Moses, his chosen one, stood in the breach before him to keep his wrath from destroying them. Then they despised the pleasant land; they did not believe his promise. They grumbled in their tents and did not obey the LORD.

Pastor's Letter (con't)

Imagine that "they forgot the God who saved them". That is what do when we neglect to give Him thanks for the abundance of blessings He showers over us continually. I looked up the word "thanks" in the Bible and found that the people of God are exhorted or commanded to give thanks to God eighty-one times. This means we have much to be thankful for.

For example, I am thankful to God for who He is, I am thankful for what he has done in my life in the past, and for what He has planned for my future. I thank Him for allowing me to be used in the life of others. I thank Him for what He reveals about Himself through His Holy Word. I thank Him for my family and the many friends He has brought into my life over the years, and I am thankful for you.

It truly is a joy to live life with a thankful heart, and it is truly joyful to be around others who have thankful hearts despite of the hardships of life. It is important to model such gratitude toward God before our family, friends, and neighbors. In this season of thanksgiving, I encourage us all to devote each day of November thanking God for His many blessings, even naming them one by one. I'm certain you will find them to be innumerable. As the old hymn says, "For life and health and all that's good we give Thee thanks, O Lord."
