From the Pastor's Desk

To All Who Find Rest in Jesus,

Yesterday I heard a news flash from London that got my attention, "Take vacations to boost your longevity".

Compared with those who took more than three weeks, men who took three weeks or less annual leave from their regular work schedule were found to be 37 percent more likely to die early, the study showed.

Our bodies were made with Sabbath DNA. God placed this spiritual genetic matter within each cell that makes up our miraculous body.

So while you are taking an American Labor Day rest by traveling, painting your house, or doing yard work, remember that God had something even better for His children in mind... a weekly rest, a weekly time-out from our hard work. A time-out from our labor, we all need it.

The Book of Hebrews is a book of comparisons. In it, the writer, who was well versed in the Torah, correctly yet concisely compares the main teachings of the OT with Jesus.

Some examples are, Jesus is better than the old way of God's communication to His people through dreams and prophecies; Jesus is better than angels; Jesus is better than all earthly priests. In Chapter 4 we see how Jesus is better than the successor to Moses, Joshua.

Joshua was the man who led the Children of Israel into the Promised Land, Canaan, but due to their hard hearts, they forfeited the promised "rest". In Hebrews 2:8 he writes, "For if Joshua had given them rest, then would he not afterward have spoken of another day". In doing so he reveals the temporal nature attached to rest in the Promised Land. The fact that they were removed from the Promised Land along with the earthly presence of God by 586 B.C. reveals this ineffectiveness of this Joshua.

In Matthew 1:20-21 the Evangelist writes, ".... an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

The people who the Book of Hebrews is addressed to understood that the name Jesus is actually a Greek rendering of the Hebrew Yeshua, which is the equivalent of Joshua.

From the Pastor's Desk (con't)

In Hebrews 4:8, the author writing in about 68 A.D. approximately 1500 years later states, "For if {the O.T. Figure} Joshua had given them {abiding} rest, God would not have spoken of another day later on. So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, for whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from his. Let us therefore strive to enter that rest, so that no one may fall by the same sort of disobedience.

Therefore, having established that Jesus fulfilled the role of the deliverer, the true Joshua, who offers eternal "rest", the writer now concentrates on us, "For if Joshua had given them rest, God would not have spoken of another day later on. So then, there remains a Sabbath rest for the people of God, for whoever has entered God's rest has also rested from his works as God did from his. Let us therefore strive to enter that rest, so that no one may fall by the same sort of disobedience". (Hebrews 4:11)

What continually kept the people out of God out of the "Promised Land" was their disobedience in trusting God at His Word. As a parent I've experience many pitfalls, one of which is when you hear one say, "I just don't believe you."

Some of us have been sitting in church week after week hearing the Word of God as summed up in the Gospel of John 20:31, but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name, yet you are still laboring in order to guarantee a place in Heaven? That is they type of disobedience that the writer of Hebrews speaks of when he exhorts us to rest from our works righteousness.

Jesus says in Matthew 11:28-30 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke on you and learn from me, because I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy to bear, and my load is not hard to carry"

Have you entered that "rest,"? Have you experienced the rest which only Christ can give? Have you ceased from fruitless efforts to win God's favor? If not, I urge you to do so "today" by acknowledging your sin and your inability to please God. And make this a Labor Day where you labor to believe God at His Word by trusting in the only provision God has made for sinners to be forgiven and to enter into His eternal rest. Trust in Jesus.

Sacred Site

Immanuel Union Church has been approved and listed as a State & National Sacred Site, by the State & National Offices of Historic Preservation.

State & National Registers are a recognized and visible component of public & private planning. The registers promote heritage tourism, economic development and appreciation of historic resources. They also are official recognition that a property is significant to the nation, the state and local community.

We have met all four of the evaluation Criteria

- Made a significant difference in American history Origins of Immanuel Union Church can be traced back to the activities of three religious groups. Mrs. Boole's Sabbath (Sunday) School, the Deems Memorial Christian Endeavor, and Union Congregational Church of Prohibition Park. Each of these groups was founded by and to serve the permanent residents of Prohibition Park
- Association with the lives of persons significant in our past
 Membership of individuals significant in past history including Dr. Isaac Funk, principal of Funk &
 Wagnall's Publishing Company, & editor of the Standard Dictionary of the English language; Dr.
 William Boole Pastor of the Willet Street Methodist Church; Dr. Edward Jewett Wheeler, Editor of
 the Literary Digest; Dr. Daniel Seely Gregory, a Presbyterian minister, former president of Lake
 Forest University; and Thomas Wardwell oil refiner and Treasurer of Standard Oil Company.

Mrs. Ella Boole, wife of Reverend William H. Boole organized the Bible Class in her home, the first house built in Prohibition Park on the southwest corner of Maine & Jewett Avenues. The house has since been demolished. Mrs. Boole was a member of the Women's Christian Temperance Union, (WCTU). She also ran on the Prohibition Party ticket as a candidate for United States Senate in 1920. Later property owners in the Westerleigh community included Edward Everett Horton of motion picture fame & William Jennings Bryan.

- Distinctive characteristics of type, period or method of construction

 Deems Memorial Chapel built in 1895 was designed in the popular shingle style of the time, by architect William Lambert. The design earned him national recognition when completed and was featured in Scientific American Building Edition in 1898. The main sanctuary built in 1916 in the Tudor Revival style of architecture most fashionable at the time of construction, designed by James Whitford Sr. noted Staten Island architect. The gymnasium designed by James Whitford Jr. was completed in 1957.
- 4) Yielded information important to history
 Our origins in the Prohibition Movement yielded to the adoption of the 18th amendment of the
 United States Constitution in 1918. Early members were involved with the prohibition and
 temperance movements in the United States.

In addition to the honorary title, listing as a New York State & Federal Sacred Site makes Immanuel Union Church eligible for matching grant funding.
