Pastor's Letter

October Greetings,

October is a great month to experience so many things which Fall offers, such as the pretty colors of the leaves as they prepare to die only to be reborn in the spring. October is also a great time to remember the Reformation. For it was on October 31, 1517, the small-town Augustian monk by the name of Martin Luther marched up to the castle church in Wittenberg and fastened his 95 Theses to the door, thus lighting the flame of the Reformation and causing a split from the Church of Rome which resulted in the birth of Protestantism. Luther's act is taught as one of the cornerstones of world history and remains a lasting symbol of resistance over spiritual tyranny even down to our day.

The hymn writer Anne Cousin wrote, "Jehovah lifted up His rod; O Christ, it fell on Thee! Thou wast sore stricken of Thy God; There's not one stroke for me. Thy tears, Thy blood, beneath it flowed; Thy bruising healeth me."

Why did Jehovah lift his rod and strike Christ? And what does this hymn have to with the Reformation? Much since both emphasize the purity of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

It was because Jesus was our substitute on the cross in that He took the punishment due for the sins of His people. This is the crux of the cross.

I Peter 3:18 says, "For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous". Christ suffered for the unrighteous. This means that the punishment he received was the penalty we deserved.

Paul, in 2 Cor. 5:21, tells us that Christ was made sin for us so we could be made the righteousness of God in him. Christ was made sin.

As our willing substitute, although sinless, Jesus our very creator became legally guilty for all the wretched sins of those He willingly laid down His life. On that day God poured upon Jesus the full fury of His wrath on His own perfect Son until the moment Jesus cried, "It is finished!" In this word, it was as if the Jews who year after year offered their lambs and goats as a means of atonement were told, "For those who are in Christ there is no more condemnation, it is finished!"

Speak to your own conscience, asking, "it is really finished? Have my sins truly been forgiven" for the sake of Jesus Christ?

A hymnist wrote, "There's not one stroke for me!" Do you possess such surety? Yet there is even more in this great exchange that the Reformation emphasizes: On that cross the sins of His

elect were credited to Jesus so that Jesus' righteousness may be credited to their morally bankrupt account.

I Cor I:30 tells us that Christ is our righteousness, just like 2 Cor. 5:21 tells us that we are made the righteousness of God in Him. You see, not only are the sins of His elect forgiven in Jesus' death, but the perfect life of Jesus is credited to them. In Christ, they are seen by God, not only as sinless but as possessing a record as righteous as Jesus Christ, Himself!

Pastor's Letter (con't)

Our position before God is found only in the righteousness of Christ. Is there any better news than that? No wonder why it's called the "gospel of Jesus Christ" i.e., "the good news of Jesus Christ".

Use this Fall season to read and reflect upon the history and implications which came out from the Reformation. There is so much to glean.
