## Position Overview:

Support the leadership and facilitation of AWAU's Community of Practice (CoP) sessions across four focus areas. Leads will convene and deliver 4-8 dynamic sessions annually (1-2 per topic area), sharing knowledge and creating spaces for peer learning. We are looking for people interested in at least one of the following focus areas (see below).

- Health: Ageing and Wellbeing
- Social Development: Care Economy, Disability, Employment
- Business: Social Entrepreneurship, Private Business, Finance, Arts
- International Affairs: Intergovernmental Processes

## Roles and Responsibilities:

- Curate and host quarterly webinars focussed on 1-2 focus areas (4-8 per year)
- Identify relevant speakers, themes, and opportunities for learning
- Contribute to outreach, promotion, participant engagement, and knowledge translation
- Collaborate with other CoP members for cross-topic integration

- Strong facilitation or public speaking skills
- Confidence working in group settings and co-creating content
- Strong organisational skills and attention to detail
- Passion for building capacity within the African community in Australia
