SSD, or a solid-state drive, is the new generation of storage. SSDs run faster by using flash-based memory. They are also more reliable as there are no moving parts like traditional mechanical hard drives. This will help your machine run faster with a quicker access to files. The lifespan of a solid-state drive is around 10 years compared to a traditional hard drive averaging 3–5 years. The majority of SSDs use less power, as they don't have spinning disks to power up, this helps the battery life for laptops. The failure rate is significantly less for SSDs but we still encourage backups. So, keep backing up no matter what kind of drive you are using. Faster, more reliable and better price points make SSD the way to go!

Be Aware

We are seeing a surge in some ransomware. Typically seen via phishing emails that contain malicious attachments or drive-by downloading. Drive-by downloading happens when a user not knowingly visits an infected website, then malware is downloaded and installed without the user's knowledge. This malicious code encrypts your data so it is not readable without a key. The attacker has the key for a price, hence the 'ransomware' name. Your best line of defense is having up-to-date security protection (antivirus, mal/spy/adware), being cautious/suspicious of any email attachments and having redundant backups of your data. It is better to be safe than sorry, take your time and question that email before you open it. If you see anything that looks different, don't open it!

Keep your keyboard clean
