Take advantage of the Ealing Smokefree Service, which provides free nicotine replacement therapy and a personalized support program to guide smokers on their journey to a smoke-free life. Attend our meetings to learn more about reducing heart health risks and find out information about available resources. Your participation can also help us offer valuable feedback to the NHS about experiences with local health services. Together, we can make a positive impact!

Last September, Heartlink took the decision to join with Ealing Council in promoting their local Smokefree Service. Since then, many of you, our members and supporters, have helped us at events across the main parts of the borough.

Smoking is a key cause of heart disease, as well as cancer and respiratory problems. Ealing is an area with a particularly high number of smokers, many of whom come from disadvantaged communities. It is these people we are trying to reach and help.

The photos show a small selection of the campaign events we have run since September. We have had considerable support from our cardiologist Trustees and other local NHS staff.

Our events have included:

- Addressing hundreds of worshippers at Greenford Mosque and at Greenford Mandir.
- A Saturday stall at Ealing Broadway Christmas Market.
- Talking to many students at a fair at the University of West London
- A training session for 50 of our members about the service
- Weekly information desks at the two main entrance areas at Ealing Hospital.
- Giving talks to regular sessions of the Cardiac Rehabilitation Service for recovering heart patients at Acton and Hanwell
- A stall at Jubilee Gardens Health Centre in Southall.

the service to patients of the Heart Failure Service in Hanwell and at the Respiratory Outpatients Clinic at Ealing Hospital.

- Promoting the service at North Southall Patient Participation Group and at many GP's surgeries in the borough.
- Linking with

 which offer the service.

We have been given help, training and leaflets by colleagues from the local West London Health Trust who coordinate the service. They report very high take up of the service – much of which is from Heartlink's work.



From the many people we have seen, in addition to smokers, many take leaflets for family members or friends who are smokers, many who wish to quit and very much welcome the offer of help. Many have tried to stop beforehand and failed.

From the hard-to-reach communities, a large number need simple, easy to understand information about how to access the service. We have prepared a handout listing the community pharmacies where the service can be accessed.

This year brings exciting changes in primary care. Digital health services are expanding, making virtual consultations more common. This means you can get medical advice from home, which is great for managing chronic conditions and minor issues.

Additionally, there's a greater focus on integrated care, bringing together various healthcare services to ensure a more coordinated approach to patient care. This means you'll have a more seamless experience when accessing different health services, with your care being managed more effectively across the board.

In recent times, many people have experienced challenges in securing timely GP appointments, a situation that is often compounded by the surgery's availability process. Patients frequently find themselves navigating a complicated system. This can result in delayed access to necessary medical care, leading to frustration and potential deterioration in health.

The strain on GP services, often made worse by staffing shortages and increasing patient demand, underscores the critical need for more efficient and compassionate triage systems. Ensuring patients can promptly access the care they need is vital for maintaining public trust and improving health outcomes.

One new key innovation option for patients is utilising 'Pharmacy First' services, which can greatly help alleviate some of these challenges by providing direct and quicker access to professional advice and minor treatment.

We encourage you to join your GP Patient Participation Group (PPG). PPGs help shape local health services. By joining, you can share your

thoughts and help improve services for everyone. Being part of a PPG keeps you informed and lets you directly impact the quality of



care. It's also a great way to meet others and work together to enhance healthcare. To join or learn more, contact your local surgery or visit your GP practice website.
