



## CrossView's Camper Rules

1. CrossView's primary rule is the golden rule: Do to others as you would have them do to you. (Matt. 7:12).
2. Campers must obey Camp Staff and Counselors (this is critical for safety).
3. Campers must stay with their group and never be out of sight/hearing of a Counselor.
4. Campers must leave the wildlife alone (no petting, capturing, feeding, etc.).
5. Campers may not climb or cross fences. Appropriate gates are available where needed. Campers must stay on Camp property unless escorted for a legitimate reason—with the Director's approval—by an adult.
6. Campers with communicable diseases of any kind will not be allowed to come to Camp. If they arrive & exhibit signs of disease, they will be sent home. If they develop an illness while at Camp, they will be sent home. This includes lice, ringworm, a fever, & anything else Camp Staff deems communicable.
7. Campers may not bring electronics. Any electronics brought to Camp will be collected on the first day and returned on the last day of Camp.
8. All clothing must be modest. This includes swimsuits, which for girls must either be a modest 1 piece or covered by a t-shirt that is not see-through when wet. Campers may wear shorts, but no short-shorts, tank tops, anything sleeveless, anything low cut or very tight, or anything with crude or suggestive language.
9. No weapons of any kind are allowed on Camp property (fireworks, airsoft guns, knives, etc.). No fighting.
11. No foul, suggestive, or otherwise inappropriate language.
12. No pranks.
13. No tobacco or alcohol is permitted on CrossView Christian Camp property.
14. Campers are expected to respect Camp property. This includes things like keeping Cabin doors shut, using reasonable amounts of toilet paper and paper towels, putting all trash in the trash cans, etc. Campers are not allowed to touch the thermostats.
15. Displays of affection are not permitted except between married couples.
16. Campers will be allowed to keep snacks in their Cabins, as long as no one eats in their bed or makes a mess. If we find food in a bed or a food mess, we will remove the food from the Cabins.
17. Campers may not keep cash in the Cabins. Snack money will be collected and be put on an account at the snack bar. Any money not spent will be returned on the last day of Camp.
18. We desire that each Camper has fun and makes friends, but our primary focus is teaching kids about Jesus Christ. Any situation or behavior that conflicts with this purpose will not be allowed.
19. If Campers cannot follow Camp rules, then we cannot keep them safe. If we cannot keep a Camper safe, we will send him/her home.
