


Proverbs 1:20-33

Out in the open wisdom calls aloud, she raises her voice in the public square; on top of the wall she cries out, at the city gate she makes her speech: "How long will you who are simple love your simple ways? How long will mockers delight in mockery and fools hate knowledge? Repent at my rebuke! Then I will pour out my thoughts to you, I will make known to you my teachings. But since you refuse to listen when I call and no one pays attention when I stretch out my hand, since you disregard all my advice and do not accept my rebuke, I in turn will laugh when disaster strikes you; I will mock when calamity overtakes you like a storm, when disaster sweeps over you like a whirlwind, when distress and trouble overwhelm you. "Then they will call to me but I will not answer; they will look for me but will not find me, since they hated knowledge and did not choose to fear the LORD. Since they would not accept my advice and spurned my rebuke, they will eat the fruit of their ways and be filled with the fruit of their schemes. James 3:1-12

Not many of you should become teachers, my fellow believers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly. We all stumble in many ways. Anyone who is never at fault in what they say is perfect, able to keep their whole body in check. When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. Likewise, the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body, sets the whole course of one's life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell. All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and sea creatures are being tamed and have been tamed by mankind, but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse human beings, who have been made in God's likeness. Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this should not be. Can both fresh water and salt water flow from the same spring? My brothers and sisters, can a fig tree bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Neither can a salt spring produce fresh water.





Our New Worship Pattern from September 15th!

Our new worship pattern, planned by the Session and endorsed by the congregation earlier this summer, is designed to build our congregational nurture, outreach and engagement by increasing opportunities for worship at different times, in different styles and in different venues. We're very happy that so many people have expressed their enthusiasm for the new model, including more worship in our beautiful chapel on Sunday mornings.

• The 9:30am service in the sanctuary will last for 30 minutes, and is designed to be relaxed enough for all ages to attend, although it is not an explicitly intergenerational service - there will still be an intergenerational joint service at 10:30am on one Sunday in most months. This service will be led by Pastor Martin, the band musicians and cantors as appropriate.

Coffee Hour will be held in the church house at 10am. Stay after the 9:30 service or come early before the 10:30 service. There is no coffee hour after 10:30am services on a Sunday when there are two services.

• The 10:30am service in the chapel will last for 1 hour and is designed with a reflective flow in mind. The service will be led by Pastor Martin and a liturgist. The music will be led by the Director of Music, Assistant Organist and the choir, with input from cantors and other musicians as appropriate.

Each month we will have a joint intergenerational service at 10:30am in the sanctuary on one of the Sundays. The schedule will be slightly different each month, so do look at this newsletter to check what's happening - details will be in the bulletins too.

Joys and Concerns. The Worship Committee has decided that from Sunday September 1st we will begin a new way of including joys and concerns in our prayers of thanksgiving and intercession on Sunday mornings.

- The prayers will then be included as appropriate in the prayers of thanksgiving and intercession.
