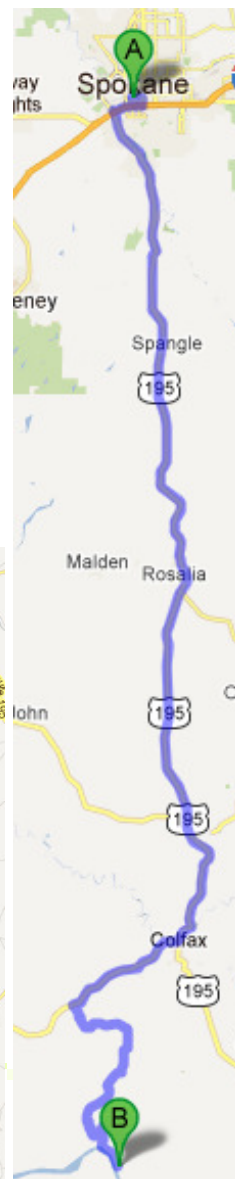
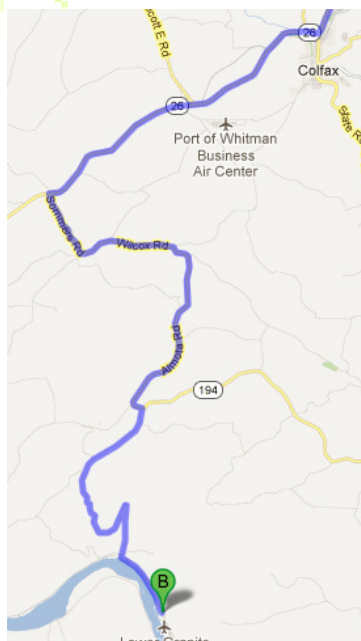

Covered shelters accommodating 50 are available for rental for those special gatherings. A convenience and RV store is handy for those forgotten items. Boyer Park offers the Snake River trail for



rollerblading, biking or a leisurely walk.

The enclosed swimming area, sandy beach, and picnic facilities make a perfect setting for the gathering of family and friends.

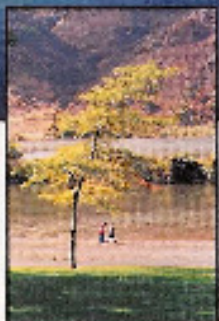
Overnight camping sites have all the extras...with water, electricity, sewer hookups, garbage collection, dump station for holding tanks, hot showers, rest rooms, laundry facilities, and picnic tables.

All facilities are open 7 days a week from mid April until mid October.

Lower Granite Lock and Dam is 2 miles from Boyer Park. The Visitor Center contains a Fish Viewing Room and Counting Station.

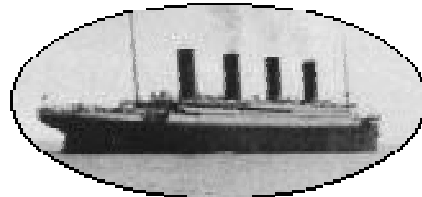

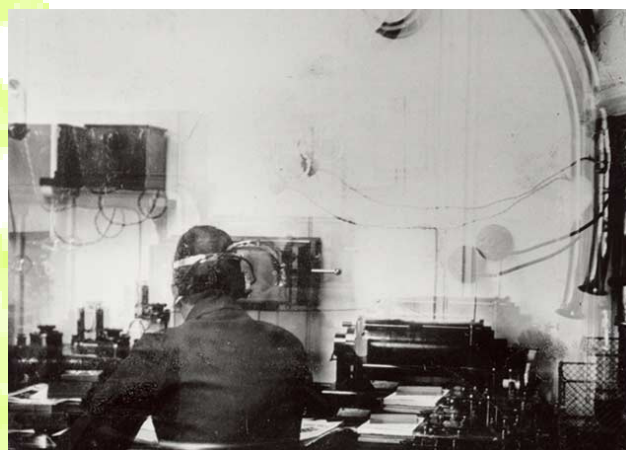
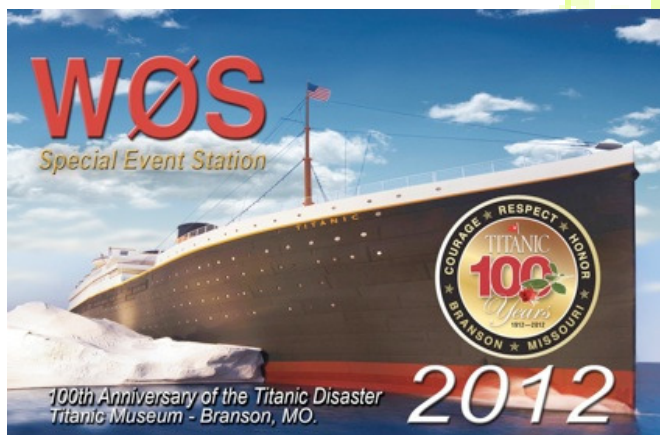

Titanic 100 years later... by Scott, KA7FVV

April 15th will commemorate the 100th anniversary since the sinking of the great ship and the loss of over 1500 people on that cold night in 1912. The Titanic is the most famous of all ship disasters in history. There is more information available in print, on video or on the web about the Titanic than any other shipwreck. With the Titanic there were so many subtle warnings of ice in its path in the days before the disaster that it might have been avoided. All of the what if's in the Titanic lore. We all know the part in history that radio played in saving the 705 that survived that night. Operators Harold Bride and Jack Phillips were employee's of the Marconi Wireless Telegraph Company. 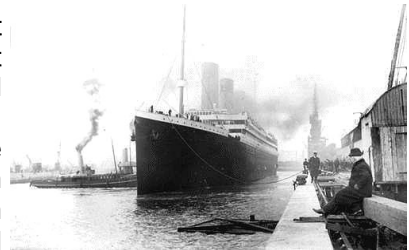

A Titanic tragedy averted for a former KBARA Member.

The following information was brought to my attention by Duff, WA7BFN and being some what of a Titanic historian thought it fitting to do some research and add this article at the 100th anniversary of the sinking. Thank you Duff for bringing this information to light. Scott, KA7FVV

As the Titanic, the White Star Lines newest luxurious ship left the docks at Southhampton, England, shown here. Reginald Hoskins, disappointed at the time, would later find out how lucky he and his parents were that he had missed the boat due to improper paperwork. Reginald would have been 11 years old at the time. He, his sister, and parents would find there way to the states and in 1919 Reginald would become a amateur radio operator with the call W7ROL. He was a long standing member of KBARA and active with the Spokane Hamfest as indicated below. He lived in Four Lakes and passed away at the age of 100 in December 2002.



On the Encyclopedia Titanica historical site he is listed as Titanic Reg. I found the following information on the eham.net web site with some nice comments and historical details from one of our area hams, Jim Colville, W7RY. Reginald Hoskins (W7ROL)

This man has seen it all. WOW! To live to be a 100 years old and as sharp as Reggie was up until the day he passed.....He was active on a daily basis on HF and 2 meters. What a treat it was to talk to him on the air! I had the pleasure to visit Reggie at his home when I lived in Spokane. He LOVED to talk about the "old days" and could he ever talk about them! What it must have been like to live through those times! To see all the advances in technology that he saw! What a wonderful thing... Some of the old magazines and catalogs that he still had that depicted what radio was as it was being invented were interesting indeed! Did you know that he was actually on the Titanic? Reggie, his mother and his baby sister boarded the ship. When the immigration authorities found that his sister did not have the proper paperwork in order, they were whisked off the ship and it set sail without them! I could only imagine! Reggie was a TRUE ham! He still had his original spark gap transmitter that he constructed when he was a young amateur. And they still worked and he could demonstrate them as to how the were used how they worked and how he had to scrounge the parts to build them! He was still active on HF and 2 meters as well. As I'm typing this, a lamp that Reggie built out of an old large vacuum tube with my callsign on the oak base lights my keyboard. I will cherish it forever as a special gift from a very special man. Reggie lived by himself with his faithful companion Bobby. Bobby the dog was even featured on one of his QSL cards. If he didn't have that faithful dog around, Reggie would not have lived as long as he did! I and many others will miss you very much. 73 Old Man and May God be with you! Jim W7RY

Thanks for that interesting contribution, Jim. You will be interested to know that Reggie joined a 2 meter net just before Thanksgiving. He was obviously distraught. His last true love, his dog Bobby, had developed an illness and had to be put to sleep. Reggie had told many friends that he didn't think he would be able to survive the passing of that dog. As it turns out, Reggie did not recover from this final heartbreak and entered the hospital shortly thereafter. I did not know Reggie well, but as chairman of the Spokane Hamfest I became aware of his presence in the amateur community. He let it be known that he felt that anyone over 95 should be able to attend the Hamfest for free! We enjoyed a good laugh over this, and so our annual Hamfest was free of charge to those under 16 and over 95! Reggie is now gone, but in his honor, I think we will keep the policy intact. I would enjoy hearing any other stories about this fine man.

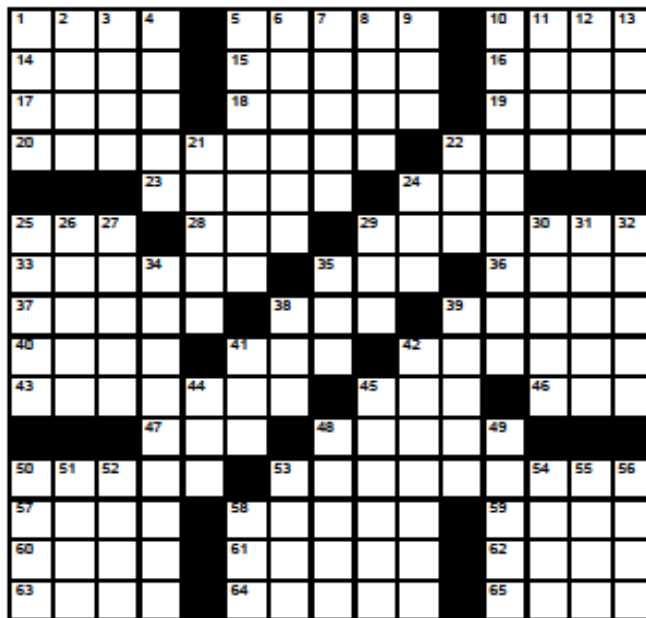

? There seems to be this thing going on between you and Glen. Would you like to expand on that?

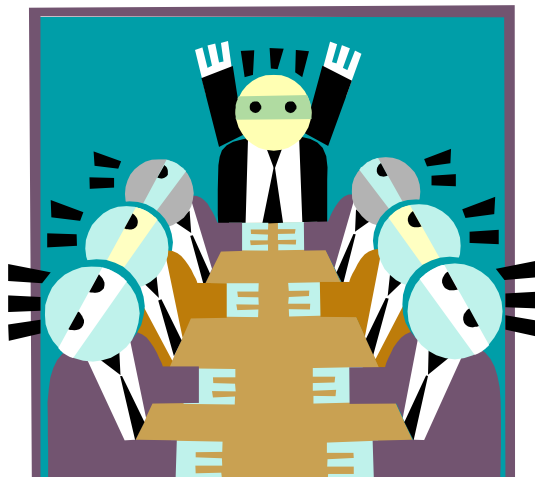

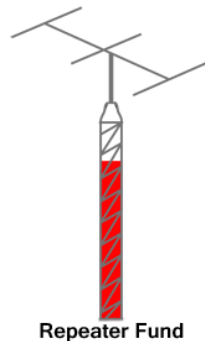

KBARA Membership / Support Information: The KBARA repeater system consists of several privately owned linked Amateur Radio repeaters. It covers an area from northeastern Washington to northeastern Oregon, and from western Montana to central Washington. The KBARA system is also part of the Evergreen Intertie, an interconnected group of repeaters located in western Washington and Oregon. The primary purpose of the KBARA repeaters is to provide a means for emergency communications within the above areas, and secondarily for routine radio traffic. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage, extending the limited range provided by any single repeater operation. The KBARA FM repeaters operate in the VHF bands and are linked by UHF radios. The repeaters' frequencies, call signs, locations and owners are as follows:
