The Evergreen Intertie is still having some problems and the owners are aware of them. They are working on it as time, money and weather allow.



Lifeguards are on duty. Fishing (non-motorized boats only), boat rental, handicap access trail, and volleyball are also available.



Also, the Spokane County Parks Department has kindly given KBARA special permission to use this "day-use only" park for the event. Here's the progress from our latest meeting held on February 11 at the Eatza Pizza Restaurant in North Spokane. Thanks to all who attended & contributed.

1. University High School ARC, as mentioned previously, is now one of the Hamfest hosting clubs, and will have their logo on the flyers along side the other six clubs'. Too, the usual \$600 Hamfest contribution to the school will continue, baring any disasters, but the school club will not financially participate with seed money as the other clubs do.
2. The KBARA/SRA Treasurer, Neil, N7LVO, has again offered to be the Hamfest Treasurer, which we certainly appreciate. He would, though appreciate assistance by the other Treasurers on Hamfest day in the handling of cash, tickets & banking.
3. The seed money structure remains unchanged: up to \$400 may be contributed by NW Tri-State, SRA, KBARA & SDXA, while up to \$200 may be contributed by the IEVHF & Palouse Hills clubs.
4. Each year, the ARRL has graciously sent a guest to our event. It was suggested that we ask the League to invite back Dan Henderson, N1ND. Dan is the League Contest Branch Manager.


