New D-Star Net originating from the KBARA System

As of Saturday, January 4th, Duff, Randy and myself started a weekly D-Star Net on our system. We connect to reflector 35C. On our first net we had 19 check-in's from around the country. We are adding the use of the D-RATS program to the net as well. No D-Star radio needed. D-RATS is a communications program that can be used either via the radio or the internet.. We will be using what is known as a ratreflector from our friends in Federal Way. The program has the default national ratreflector in place. Under preferences and radio add WA7FW, network and wa7fw.dstargateway.org, leave port 9000. For the net uncheck the RAT connection and just leave WA7FW checked. Go to the chat tab and you should see stations connected. Go to www.d-rats.com to download the program and see information about what it does.

Net is every Saturday originating from the KBARA D-Star Repeater on Reflector 35C and on D-RATS on the WA7FW Ratreflector. Come join the fun!



Love My Baofeng

I recently was given a Baofeng UV-5RA Dual-Band handheld from a disgruntled owner. The main objection from owners of this Chinese radio is the difficulty in manually programming memory channels. Also, this information is not contained in the Instruction Manuel. This radio is available for under \$30.00 and covers the full 2-Meter and 70 CM (440 MHz) bands plus some out of band frequencies. I own at least ten handhelds that I have purchased over the years and this is by far the best handheld for the money. Instead of pontificating, I will include a link by WP4AOH which gives (in my opinion) the best step by step instructions for programming this radio. By the way, I use this radio every day to cross-band to my Kenwood Dual Band FM radio at home (one mile from the office). It works like a charm and the LED light makes a great flashlight for opening the gates at work. 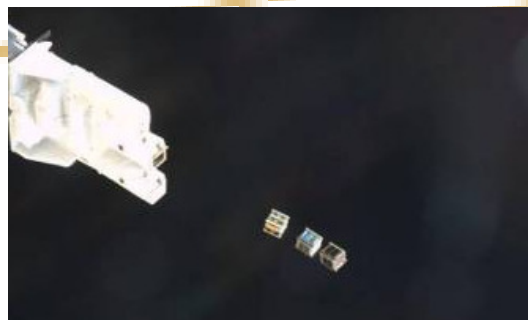

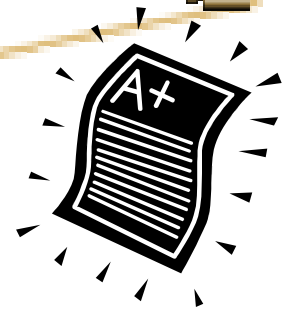

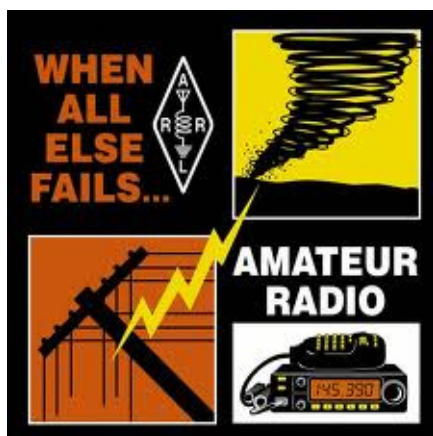
KBARA Membership / Support Information: The KBARA repeater system consists of several privately owned linked Amateur Radio repeaters. It covers an area from northeastern Washington to northeastern Oregon, and from western Montana to central Washington. The KBARA system is also part of the Evergreen Intertie, an interconnected group of repeaters located in western Washington and Oregon. The primary purpose of the KBARA repeaters is to provide a means for emergency communications within the above areas, and secondarily for routine radio traffic. It makes possible a single system of mobile communications coverage, extending the limited range provided by any single repeater operation. The KBARA FM repeaters operate in the VHF bands and are linked by UHF radios. The repeaters' frequencies, call signs, locations and owners are as follows:

All licensed Amateur Radio operators are welcome to use this open repeater system. Your support would also be greatly appreciated.

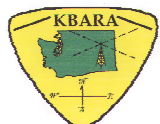
