KBARA Annual Meeting Minutes

June 8, 1996

The meeting was called to order by JoAnn KA7SUZ at 5:10 pm. We waited for more people to show.

The minutes from last years Annual Meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurers Report was unavailable due to the absence of the Treasurer however the bank statement was available and it was discussed.

Technical Report was given by Art WB7AUK and is as follows:

147.28 lost the 35 amp power supply and a new one was purchased and taken to the hill top. The Old power supply is on its way to Art so that it can be re-built and used at another location.

146.74 Needs a Technician for repairs. Just what is wrong there is not known as yet.

147.02 has lost the Packet radio or something in the packet system. The hill is not accessible as yet. Still has snow. There is an antenna problem that is known and will cost about \$100.00 to put another one on the hill.

147.38 Due to the kindness of the owner, one of the 220 antennas was moved to eliminate interference with another system. The move has created problems with the KBARA system and the antenna will be moved back to its original place and the interference problem will be dealt with through other means.

147.36 A problem with the Autopatch system is being worked on. The 220 back-bone that the Autopatch system works with is not working at all at this time. Also the fee from \$600.00 has been dropped to \$100.00 after a five month battle. It was pointed out that the legislature had already set the fee but someone locally decided to over-ride it and charge the higher amount.

Hamfest

It seems that a lot of people want the Hamfest but few are willing to help with the event. There has been someone that has stepped forward to help with seminars. The fliers have been printed with one error. The

KBARA treasurer and the KBARA address still appear on the flier as a mailing address.. The IE VHF Club is this years Host club. Garry Casey will be calling a meeting shortly to get the ball rolling with money in hand..

Hamfest Food

The question was raised about the Food Services at the Hamfest. Last year KBARA did it and made pretty good money. The out-lay was about \$600.00 to \$800.00 and the profit was very nice. Grills and Fans for cooking and for the rooms have already been arranged. Cash should be kept on hand for extra goods as needed like pop or buns or that sort of thing.

Net Info

A Youth Net was discussed for the KBARA system and all present agreed that it would be a good idea. The subject of the Evergreen Intertie already having such a net was also brought up. It seems that the Owner of the system has strong feelings about the Evergreen Intertie and what they have to say about what we do with our system. He would be more than happy to see a Youth net HERE along with the possible Weather Net on this side since we have our own National Weather Service Office.

A Motion was put to the group asking that a poll be taken of the listeners of the net on Wednesday night to see if there would be enough interest in a KBARA Youth Net and/or a KBARA Weather Net.

The motion was seconded and carried.

To Access the Autopatch

- 1. Identify Your Station**
- 2. Key your mic and push the * and 123 to bring up the patch**
- 3. Wait for a dial tone**
- 4. Dial the number (or Speed Dial Number)**
- 5. When finished with the call, key your mic, push # and 123 to turn the patch off**
- 6. Identify your station and that you are 'Clear of the Patch'**
