The Presidents Corner

Greetings,

Since the last newsletter a number of events have occurred within the KBARA system, and I shall mention a few here. First, the repeater at Stranger Mt. (also called Stensgar Mt. - 147.96/36 mhz) has been sold by Art Gemmrig, WB7AUK to Royal Moore, KB7WTO and John Dempster, W7OE. We applaud the new owners for assuming this responsibility, and want to mention to the users that no changes are planned for this repeater, except the call sign - it still will be part of the KBARA system.

Next, the Lookout Pass repeater (147.62/02 mhz) on the Idaho/Montana border has suffered severe damage this winter. As soon as weather permits, repairs will begin on that site. A new tower and two meter antenna may be required. Needless to say, we are desperate for your support on this one.

And I regret to say that Jessie Ruby Peterson, WO7C, will be stepping down as net manager

and control operator. For many years she has more than fulfilled these responsibilities, and the owners and supporters are deeply indebted to her for this. We wish to extend our gratitude to her.

The latest new net to be added to our growing list is the Nightcrawlers' Net, an informal ragchew net open to all every Sunday through Friday from 11PM to the wee hours of the morning.

Included in this newsletter is the latest map of the intertie system. The main portion covering Washington and Oregon was given to us by the Wenatchee Mountain Repeater Group. We wish to thank them for that.

Lastly, I wish to propose two changes to the bylaws, to be voted upon at the annual meeting. They are as follows:

1. Regarding life members, I wish the membership privilege granted to extend to the individual member, as well as to their family. Currently the privilege is granted to only the individual.

2. Regarding authorized expenditures granted by the officers: currently that amount is limited to \$200 for any one action, with the exception of repeater site rentals. I wish that

amount to be increased to \$500. It is extremely awkward to await voter approval at the annual meeting when trying to expedite repeater repair work throughout the year.

We look forward to seeing everyone at the annual meeting on June 21.

I will mention that Neil took some great pictures that we hope he will have at the annual June Meeting. Needless to say, one antenna seems to be lost in the snow with others just barely hanging on to

what is still left of the tower. In the pictures you can see one of the crew literally standing on top of the two story building roof and he didn't need a ladder to get there. In short, there is still plenty of snow up there and any repairs will have to wait till July or possibly August. The Kamaik Butte repeater is back up and running thanks to John, W7OE, who took a trip down a few week ends ago. It isn't working at its best but it is up and running. The Stensgar Mountain repeater, 147.36 is up and running but seems to have a hearing problem for some reason. Also the 220 link between the 147.36 machine and the 147.38 machine on Mica seems to be having a few problems. I have heard that when the road is passable there will be a trip made to that one to check it out. The Pikes Peak repeater, 147.28 serving the Walla Walla area and surroundings has been acting nicely for a while now. Lets hope it stays that way. Many thanks to both N7LVO AND W7OE for checking out the Lookout Pass situation and for W7OE's effort in making the Kamiak Butte system work again.

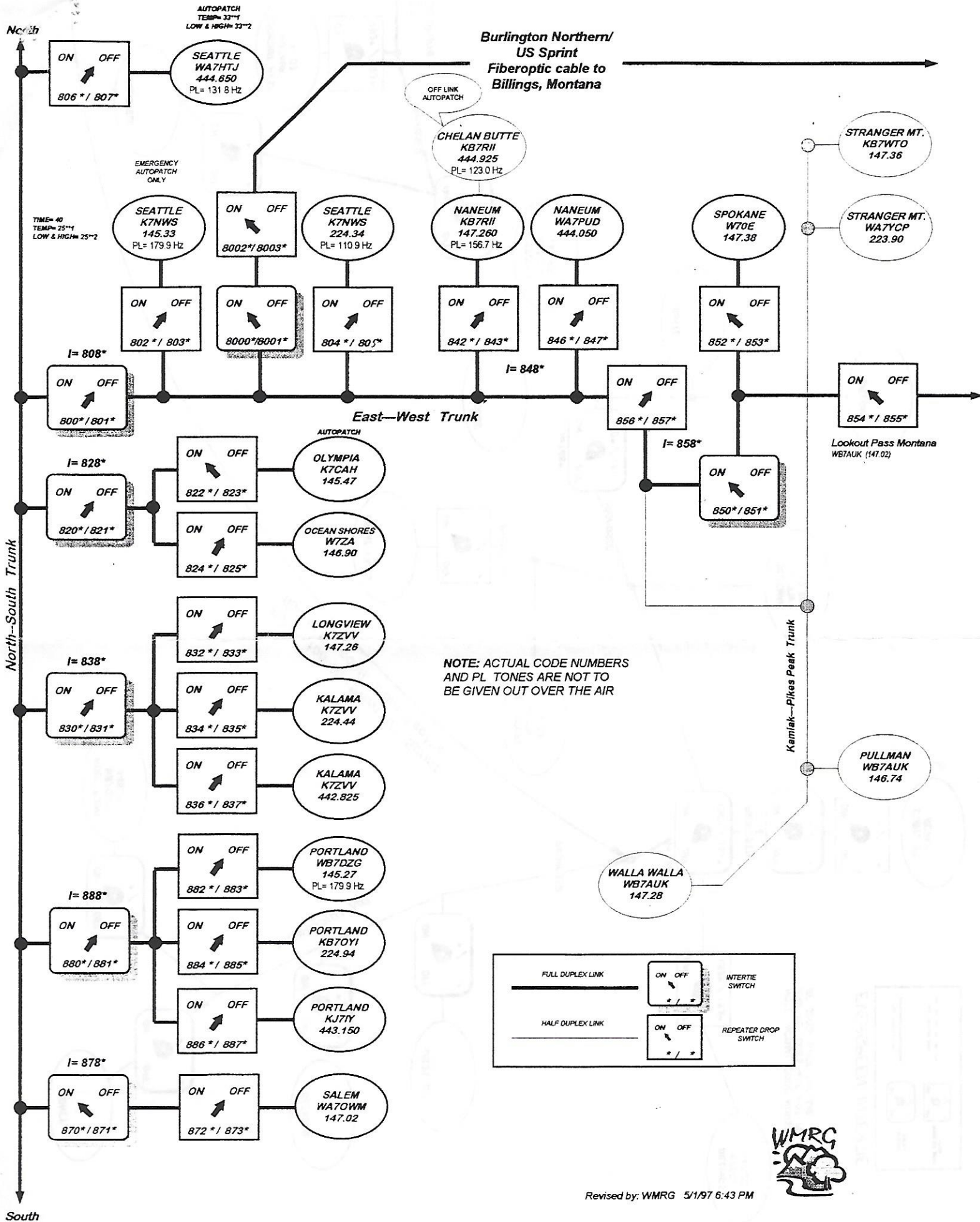
